Ringmore Boundary Stones Project September 2010



Nancy and George Grimshaw lived in Ringmore for many years, participating fully in the life of the parish. Both are buried in the graveyard of All Hallows, Ringmore's parish church.

In 2010, the family of Nancy and George embarked on the project of installing a series of stones to mark out the Ringmore parish boundary. The idea was to place large boundary stones – each up to five tons in weight – at key points along the boundary line. Most would be at places where the parish boundary is crossed by public footpaths and would be positioned so as to add interest to their settings and to provide an attractive place for walkers to rest.

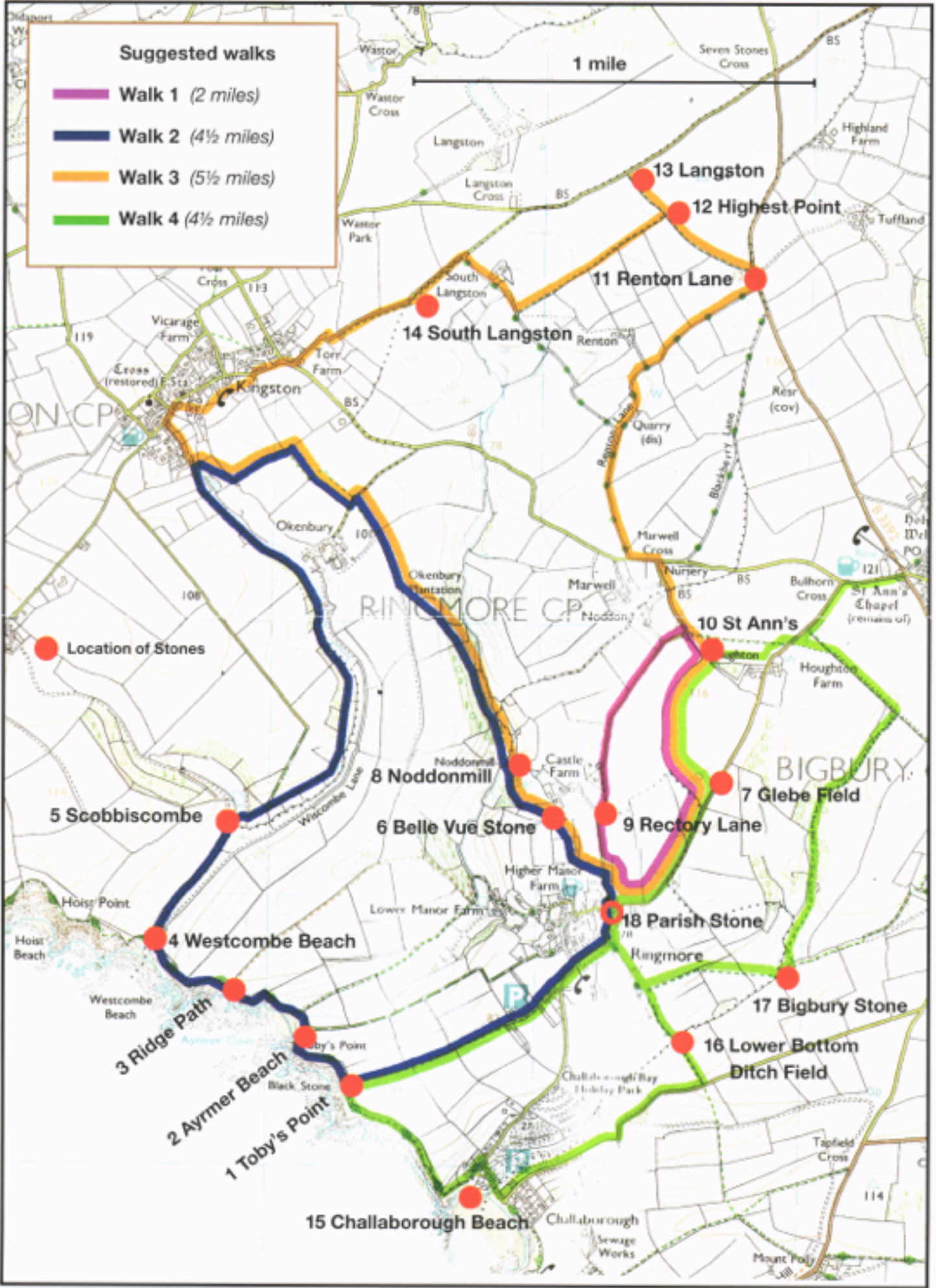
After discussion and consultation, work began in September 2010 starting with a blessing of the workers and their machines outside All Hallows. Now, after a year, all the stones have settled in and this leaflet has been produced to introduce a number of interesting walks that take in the stones around the parish boundary.

One of the 2010 boundary stones is on the route of the new and recently-completed footpath from Ringmore to St Ann's Chapel, a most welcome project undertaken and realized by Ringmore Parish Council in accordance with their 2007 Parish Plan.

Ringmore Parish Boundary Stone Walks



Notes on domestic details following the Village Fete and discussions with residents and families.

1. Flags

John Grimshaw to arrange for 4 flags to be made up, 2 as pennants to fly from the lorry delivering the stones from Lee Moor, and 2 as large flags to feature in photographs.

2. Time Capsules

Here the idea is to put together a small package or container to be buried beneath each stone. The package might contain items from the present time which might be of great interest to an archaeologist in perhaps 100 years or 1000 years time! Possible time capsules are to be prepared by

Time capsules need to be complete by Monday 20th September. We will try to let you know the approximate time your stone will be set so you can dig in your capsule, or they should be left with Di and Dennis Collinson at Belle Vue. Further ideas and offers for time capsules will be welcome as we would like to have one under every stone. If you are making up a sealed container, please photograph the contents spread out just so we can show this picture in the project book.

3 Ceremonies and Services The provisional arrangements which I am sure will be revised as the week proceeds are as follows;

Tuesday 21st 9.30 Vicar to bless the work, the stones and the machines at Journeys End car park.

Sunday 26th September 3pm. Service of Thanksgiving for the land and bounty within the Parish Boundary followed by blessing of the Parish Stone and tea.

Tea at WI Hall at 4.00pm after service with presentation to landowners and contractors.

4 Photographers

The lead photographer is Mike Wynne-Powell. He will need assistance as a lot is going on. So please contact him if you can help out.

5 Local events and adopting the stones

At this stage nothing is programmed but residents and visitors are encouraged to visit the works, to see the stones, and to consider "adopting" a favourite stone. All ideas for walks, runs, histories and other events are very welcome and everyone is encouraged to fit the boundary stones into their calendar as much as they can.

6 The works will be directed and supervised by John Grimshaw who maybe contacted on 07792 714708, or if phone reception is poor via Di Collinson. Please note that Nick Rowell who is organising the haulage and positioning of the stones will occasionally be moving equipment on local roads. We apologise if this causes any inconvenience.

7 Saturday 25th September is the day for finishing off any small works and tidying up around the stones. We would particularly welcome assistance in the morning to build a length of drystone wall out to Toby's Point.

8 We hope to produce a short bulletin at the end of each day and post this is the Journey's End, and at the Church to keep the public updated.
