ALL HALLOWS CHURCH

All Hallows Church was built in its present form around 1240, the tower being added the following century. A major restoration was carried out by the Revd Francis Hingston-Randolph in the latter part of the 19th century, when the painting over the chancel arch was discovered. In the early 20th century, the nave walls were lined with decorative tinplate; this caused condensation and was replaced in 1961, by the present render.

Whilst the building has been maintained in a sound structural condition, the ravages of time and weather mean that major work is now required. Replacement of some roof tiles, renewal of drain and gutter systems and comprehensive repointing of walls, all of which are labour intensive, are likely to cost £100,000.
