1. Hugh - in all probab^{ly} inst^o before 1257 when Bovecombe Register begins,
on his death - "Hugonis, ultimi Incumbentis", - Bishop Guent admitted
2. Henry de Lyneton - 15th Nov: 1284 on the pres^t of Sir Giles de Fissecre
3. Robert de Dourne - was adm. by Bp St. Edmund 18 May 1324 on the pres^t of
Sir Robert le Jeu. The church had been vacant since the Fri: aft the 7 of S Ambrose (Ap^l)
4. William de Ferrers was adm by Bp Grandisson, 1 Feb. 1354, patronis ea vice
Edm & Oliver Chamberlaine of Modbury in virtue of an assignment of the manor
of Ringmore & the advowson of the church, made to them by one Ralph Semelie, a priest
5. John Mayn. Date of inst^t not recorded - on his death Bp Stafford admitted
6. John Stancombe 17th June 1396; patronis ea vice St John Chudleigh Knt, John Hull
of Exeter & John Dartburgh in virtue of a feoff^t made to them by the late Richrd Kirkham.
To him Bp St. granted a die^t, 14 Nov: 1410 to cel: Div Scov "in capell. St Katherine, infra
limits par. de Ridmore" himself or by any other priests whom he should allow. - at Okebury.
7. William Palmer MA was adm by Bp Haig 2 Oct: 1434 on the pres^t of Rob. Kirkham - on his
resignation (& a pension from the revenues of the living was assigned to him £ 14 p.a. f d g u m)
8. Thomas Derry was promoted to Ringmore from Newton S. Cyres V. 28. June 1465, on
pres^t of Nicholas Kirkham.



Thomas Mills was born c. 1746; in August 1771
he was ordained priest and became curate of Ringmore
at a stipend of £35 a year plus fees. He was resident in the
parish for an absentee Rector, Dr. Thomas Baker D.D.
Rector of Ringmore from 1758 to 1803 (a common
a common arrangement at the time). He soon met
Honoria Knaptton, the daughter of William Knaptton
of Bigbury Court, next to the church (now the Menap
House) and ^{soon} married her at Bigbury church on ~~2~~ ² December
