









Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-Nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer, and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care?

Terry steps back Holding the New Testament in her right hand, Lesley faces the People

I, Lesley Jean, do swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second, her heirs and successors, according to law. So help me God.

Still holding the New Testament, Lesley faces the Bishop

I, Lesley Jean, do swear that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Exeter and his successors, in all things lawful and honest. So help me God.

The whole congregation stands. Lesley kneels before the Bishop.

The Bishop reads the Licence to the people, and then delivers it to the new minister saying:

Lesley, receive this authority for ministry which is both mine and yours; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen

The Lord give you courage, wisdom, strength and love to do his will; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and upon all your work done in his name, now and for evermore. **Amen**

Lesley stands, steps back and Terry stands before the Bishop Terry takes a New Testament in his right hand and faces the Bishop

 Robert Terry, will give due obedience to the Lord Bishop of Exeter and his successors in all things lawful and honest.

I, Robert Terry, about to be licensed to exercise the Office of Reader in the diocese of Exeter and in the Modbury Team do hereby promise to endeavour, as far as in me lies, to promote peace and unity, and to conduct myself as becomes a worker for Christ, for the good of his Church, and for the spiritual welfare of all people. I will give due obedience to the minister in whose cure I may serve, in all things lawful and honest.

Terry then kneels before the Bishop. The Bishop commends him to the prayers of the congregation, and a silence is kept. Then the Bishop says:

Almighty and everlasting God, by whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified: hear our prayer which we offer for all your faithful people, that in their vocation and ministry each may be an instrument of your love; and give to your servant now to be admitted the needful gifts of grace; through our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.

We meet in his name and share his peace. The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

All may exchange a sign of peace - the altar is prepared

A collection will be taken for the **Bishop's Discretionary Fund** which is used to support clergy and their families in times of need.

¶ The Welcome and Peace

The Welcome

The Churchwardens, ministers of other local churches and representatives of the local community come forward

Each of them greets the new minister audibly in the words of a single sentence. They all then join together to say

We welcome you to this new ministry, and look forward to working together with you.

The new minister replies briefly using these or similar words

Thank you for your welcome. May God help me to be worthy of your trust, and to serve faithfully in this place. I greet you all in the name of the Lord

We welcome you among us in his name

The new minister gives out any notices

The Peace

All stand

Christ is our peace. He has reconciled us to God in one body by the cross. The Bishop delivers the Licence to Terry saying:

Terry, take authority to exercise your ministry as a Reader in this diocese and in this Team; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The Spirit of truth lead you into all truth, give you grace to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, and to proclaim the word and works of God; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and upon all your work done in his name now and for evermore.

Amen.

The Installation

The new minister stands. The Bishop says to the Archdeacon:

We have licensed Lesley to this benefice. Will you now please install her as Team Vicar

The Churchwardens lead the Archdeacon and the new minister to the place where the bell is tolled. The minister tolls the bell

The Churchwardens then lead the new minister and the Archdeacon to the reading desk

The Archdeacon places the new minister in the reading desk. She kneels and the Archdeacon says

The Lord himself be your keeper: the Lord be your defence upon your right hand. The Lord defend you from all evil; may he be the guardian of your life. The Lord defend your going out and your coming in: from this time forth for evermore.

The Archdeacon and the Churchwardens return to their places. All kneel

The new minister commends the life and work of the benefice, to almighty God; and after a period of silent prayer, says

We beseech you, O Lord, to hear the prayers of your people; and grant that they may both perceive and know what things they ought to do, and also may have grace and power faithfully to fulfil the same; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Symbol of Oil

Presenting the oil of healing, a member of the pastoral care team says

Be among us as a person of reconciliation, showing God's forgiveness and healing.

The new minister says

Let us minister together, by God's grace, to be a Christ-like community of love.

The oil is placed near the Pascal Candle

An Affirmation of Shared Ministry

The Archdeacon, Team Rector and Lay Chair of the Deanery Synod stand with the Bishop where they are joined by members of the Ministerial Team. The Bishop asks people from the team to stand and then says

St. Paul says of the ascended Christ:

The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ.

The ministry of the church is shared by all of God's people, exercising their particular gifts. You are God's people in this place: will you work together, encouraging one another in your gifts and ministries, to build up your common life of worship, mission and service as a living part of Christ's church?

The whole congregation stands and says

Almighty God, we offer you ourselves, all that we are, all that we have, for work in your service. Help us to live and work together to your praise and glory, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Bishop says

Almighty God, who has given you the will to undertake all these things, give you also the grace to perform them, that he may complete that work in you which he has begun; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
