It is situated on the Village Green, 40m south-west of the Journey's End Inn. It has a fine stone well-house. The spring has been dry since the main sewer pipe was laid under Rocky Path in 1960. This broke through the underground stream which fed the spring. Until the arrival of Mains Water in the village, the spring was the principle water supply. DES=VIS=-/-/1986 (SNELL). THREE HAMMER PONDS, EXTENDING IN A LINE FOR FIVE HUNDRED YARDS ABOVE THE ABOVE GRID REFERENCE TO 63804745. THEY ARE SITUATED ON THE STREAM WHICH IS THE BORDER BETWEEN RINGMORE AND KINGSTON. THERE IS ANOTHER SUCH POND FURTHER DOWNSTREAM AT 64304650. IT IS PROBABLE THAT THEY WERE CONSTRUCTED BY THE OWNERS OF OKENBURY MANOR. THEY ARE NOT MARKED ON THE 1960 ORDNANCE SURVEY MAP, WHICH IS BASED ON A 6 INCH MAP OF 1953, BUT ARE ALMOST CERTAINLY OLDER - POSSIBLY NINETEENTH OR EARLY TWENTIETH CENTURY. THEIR ORIGINAL PURPOSE IS NO LONGER EVIDENT (SNELL).
