Mr Edwards fell from the cliffs and was killed on his way home from fishing at Salcombe. The Lord of the Manor built a stable for his widow and she had a pony and trap and sold fish.

1909 Jack Ryder, Chief Stoker on HMS Cumberland, bought all 4 cottages and re-named them.

1909-1957 Jack and Nellie Ryder
Jack died 1952
Nellie died 1957

1959-1985 Mrs Aimee Eames
Bought No1 and No2
Used old stable as Studio
Died 1985

1986-1992 Mr and Mrs Somerville
Moved to Wales

1992- Dr and Mrs Antebi
In 1996 bought land behind cottages.
Holiday cottage until 2003
then permanent home
Combined with No2 in 2002
