PARISH COUNCIL

Burglary. P.C. Penrice has suggested that, in view of the spate of burglary in this area, people should keep a note of the serial numbers of their electrical equipment. It would also be wise to photograph antiques against a ruler.

Firearms. P.C. Penrice will visit every person applying for the renewal of a gun licence. He has stressed the fact that firearms certificates should be signed. It is an offence not to do so.

Trees. The Parish Council is to purchase and plant a pink horse chestnut tree alongside the bus shelter; to replace the one which has died. It is feared that road salt may have killed the previous tree and soil will be excavated and replaced by fresh soil. <u>Planning</u>. It has been made quite clear to the Planning Committee of the South Hams District Council that there would be strong opposition to any development on the Orchard behind the Journey's End Inn. It is felt that this site, at the centre of the village, should be kept as an open space.

Inter-Parish Quiz. Ringmore will again enter the inter-parish quiz this year and Mr. W. Warne will be the Team Manager.

Blackberry Lane. This green lane has become very overgrown and the Parish Council has asked the District Council for help in clearing it.

He will outline the facilities available in rural areas. Many feel that leisure facilities and other privileges enjoyed in towns are denied to people in rural areas. Mr. Grant will explain what is being done to overcome this problem and he wants us to tell him what we would like. Please do come along to meet him.
