#### RINGMORE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Our Church Bells. Following the articles on the Church Bells and their refurbishing recently, I would like to thank John and Reg for the work they have done. The bells are much easier to chime and their notes are more resonant and sweeter. This might therefore be the right moment to give you the history of the bells as far as it is known. They are the survivors of a Ring of Three recorded in an inventory of 1553 when the Commissioners spelt the name RYDDEMORE. At one time they were a peal but now they can be chimed only. They were re-hung in October 1869 by Mr. Wm. Aggett of Chagford and again afte an inspection in 1962.

TREBLE BELL. The late Rev. H. T. E. Ellacombe of Clyst St. George who made a special study of the bells of the Diocese recorded that our Treble Bell is one of the oldest in the Diocese. It has no name of the founder or of a Warden of the time, only the founder's mark I.T. His name is not known but he was working in Exeter around 1440. The bell has inscribed in 'Black Letter' which is notoriously hard to read 'Voce Mea Viva Depello Cuncta Novica' trans. 'With my living voice I drive away all things that may do hurt'. It is 29 '/ " in diam. and sounds 'C' Sharp.

SECOND BELL. This was recast by MEARS of London in 1869. It is 30 min diam. and Sounds 'B'. It was previously recast by a local founder Mordecai Cockey of Totnes. The old inscription used to read: 'Nicholas Hooppell Ch Warden - Mordecai Cockey cast me in Totnes 1692'. Nicholas Hooppell probably lived in Cottage Farm which is now Cross Manor. The bell is inscribed Defunctos ploro - plebem voco - festa decoro I mourn the dead, I call the people - I honour the festivals.

TENOR BELL. It is the largest bell 32;" in diam. and sounds 'A' sharp. It was recast by AMBROSE GOODING of Plymouth in 1740. The inscription reads: 'IAMES GILBERT WARDEN:A GOODING 1740' James Gilbert occupied one of the Tenements at Marwell and is listed in the Survey of 1754. Gooding's bells had a faulty design in the crown staple and the clapper tended to fall out. There are few of his bells left in Devon. The crown staple in our bell has been strengthened, no doubt because of the technical knowledge of Hingeston Randolph at the time of the re-hanging in 1869. So we have one of the few remaining Gooding bells in Devon. (Note: The spelling error of the inscription is on the bell.)
Authority: Rev. H. T. Ellacombe. Prebendary John Scott of Bampton. G.C.G.

HELP! HELP! HELP!

The project to work tapestry seat runners for our Church, started at the W.I. monthly afternoon gatherings last year, has received considerable support from W.I. members, the Church, and friends inside and outside the village, both in the form of donations and in the actual tapestry work. So far, 4 have been completed, and a further 16 are well in hand, but we require more helpers. You do not have to be an expert - it really is very easy - and everyone involved, finds it fascinating. The Annual Parish Meeting took place on Tuesday 11 April, and, apart from councillors and visitors from outside the parish, only seven people attended. This was a great pity, because Mr. Tremlett - formerly Director of Finance and Secretary of South Hams District Council - gave a very clear explanation of the new Community Charge, which he called "a dreadful tax".

Next April, instead of a rates bill going to the householder, everyone over eighteen living in a house will receive a separate bill - although husbands and wives will be taxed together. In the South Hams, the Personal Charge will be about £220 and everyone will pay this in 10 instalments. The owners of holiday houses will pay their Personal charge in the area of their principle home and, in addition, they will pay a standard charge (probably about £440 in this area) for their holiday home. One problem for this parish is that we will no longer be credited with the Business Rates for Challaborough.

In addition to our local policeman, P.C. Penrice, the Annual Parish Meeting was attended by Inspector Allen from Kingsbridge. He told the meeting that, last year, there were 17 offences in the parish and 7 of the offenders were detected. Most of the offences took place in Challaborough and none of them involved violence.

In his Annual Report, Mr. Guy Eddy summarised a very full year's work for the Council, including the consideration of three dozen planning applications for nineteen different sites Mr. Brian McCabe had inspected the Ringmore telephone box every day, as part of the "Watch-a-box" scheme and, under this scheme, British Telecom had awarded Ringmore £180 for The Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the refurbishing the bus shelter and notice boards. Parish Council, who were formally presented with this award, had asked for and received an assurance that our old red telephone box would not be replaced by one which would be out of keeping with the village.

The Parish Council had received a helpful reply from our M.P. to the letter which we wrote in support of Thurlestone's suggestion that parish councils should be entitled to appeal against a planning consent, which was granted by a District Council in the face of considerable local opposition.

Mr. Steen said "Certainly I think something needs to be done, and I hope this might be possible sooner rather than later "Thurlestone Parish Council and the Devon Association of Parish Councils also welcomed our letter.

Dogs on Beaches. The District Council wishes to make a byelaw banning dogs from Challaborough beach and part of Bigbury on Sea beach, from the beginning of May until the end of The Parish Council has been asked for its views on this proposal September each year. and the matter will be considered at the next meeting, on 2 May.
