PARISH COUNCIL

Planning. At its last meeting, the Parish Council considered four minor planning applications and no objection was made to any of these. The applications concerned:-

- (1) The division of The Captain's House at Challaborough into two separate houses.
- (2) The conversion of two of the barns at South Langstone into houses instead of flats.
- (3) The addition of a porch to one of the converted barns at Marwell Farm.
- (4) The provision of a driveway from the road and parking spaces at No. 2 Crossways.

It was decided to ask the Chairman of South Hams District Council to visit The Orchard. Ringmore, in order to see the devastating effect of the development which was foisted on the village by the District Planners, despite the strongest possible opposition from local residents.

Meanwhile questions are being raised about the building being erected on Site No. 1, which is not in accordance with the plans approved by the District Council.

A representative of Devon Watersports has agreed that, if Captain Blazeby's Jet Skis. refusal to grant a licence for the hire of jet skis was revoked, the following conditions would be observed :-

- (1) No more than three jet-skies would be in operation at any one time. Any new machines would be larger, safer and quieter.
- (2) Jet skiers would be ferried by boat to a buoy to the right of Challaborough Bay. Jet ski-ing would start and finish at this buoy.

- (3) Jet ski-ing would not start before Easter and would finish by the end of September.
- (4) Daily times for jet ski-ing would be ll a.m. 6 p.m.
- (5) Life jackets would be warn and skis would be hired only to those capable of swimming in the open sea.
- (6) Jet skis would not be refuelled on the beach but only in the garage provided by the camp.
- (7) All maintenance work would take place in this garage.
- (8) Not more than twelve gallons of petrol would be stored in this garage and there would be adequate insurance and fire precautions.
- (9) Adequate insurance would be obtained, to cover accidents with jet skis.
- (10) The public toilets at Challaborough would not be used as changing rooms, for washing wet suits etc. or for cleaning engines.
- (11) There would be no jet ski-ing by Devon Watersports in Challaborough Bay but only beyond the 10 knot marker buoys.

In the light of these conditions and because it was felt that the operators of Devon Watersports would assist the Lifeguard in controlling private jet ski-ers, the Parish Council agreed to support the application for a licence. This agreement was subject to review at the end of the season - in the light of comments by residents and the camp management.

Divers. There have, unfortunately, been two fatalities among divers at Challaborough, during the past five weeks. The most recent victim had not received proper sub-aqua training and it is hoped that the sad accident will focus attention on the danger of diving without such training. P.C. Penrice has asked the Parish Council to thank the Auxiliary Coastguards, the Holiday Camp and the residents of Challaborough for all their help in dealing with the accident.

<u>Wild Flowers</u>. The Parish Council has requested Devon County Council not to cut the road banks and verges - except on dangerous corners - until the late summer, when the wild flowers have finished blooming. On the whole, Devon County Council is very good about this and the verges have been particularly beautiful this year. However some were cut, quite un-necessarily, early in May.

Trees. If any resident wishes to have free saplings of native trees to plant on their property, they should contact Mrs. Ardene Bennett at Hill Cottage (Tel: 810398) Orders should be placed before the end of August.

Footpaths/Bridlepaths. Complaints have been received that motor cyclists are using the footpaths/bridlepaths to the cove. Parishioners are reminded that footpaths may only be used by pedestrians, and bridlepaths only used by pedestrians and equestrians.

Audit. The P.C. books have now been audited, and these may be inspected at Highcroft by arrangement with the Chairman Mr. G. Eddy (810203) between 17 and 25 July.
