We would like to draw your attention to the Parish Council News regarding Ringmore Community Post Office.

## PARISH COUNCIL

<u>Post Office</u>. The Parish Council was shocked to discover that the present Post Office is to close on 6 July. As when they decided to cut the hours to mornings only, the owners did not discuss this decision, and its effect on the village, with the Parish Council. The Post Office authorities would be willing to retain a small community Post Office in the village, if somebody can be found who would be sufficiently public spirited to run this in their own home. Finally as well as offering a service to the community, salary depends on the number of hours you are able to offer.

Listed Buildings. The statutory list of buildings of special architectural or historic interest was extended in January 1990 to include a number of additional buildings in Ringmore - including Ivy Cottage and the Post Office. The owners of these buildings were all informed, by the Department of the Environment, that "listed buildings" must be protected and that consent must be obtained from the planning authority for any proposed structural alterations. It is an offence to alter a listed building without consent and the penalties for this can be heavy.

Notwithstanding this warning the windows and window sills of Ivy Cottage and the Post Office have been replaced by uniform modern windows, which are totally out of character with the building.

The Parish Council has made an immediate complaint about this to the planning authority.

Challaborough Caravans. Following Mrs. Tate's appeal, in the last Newsletter, for support in resisting the passage of huge caravans through Ringmore village, the Parish Council has had further discussions about this matter. It seems that, unless the caravans can be assembled on site in Challaborough, the only practicable solution is to transport them to the Camp by another route. The possibility of this is being explored by the Parish Council, in consultation with the Camp Authorities.

Challaborough Beach. The Parish Council has asked for the urgent provision of a rubbish skip at Challaborough and for replacement of the concrete rubbish bin, which was smashed in the winter storms.

It will also suggest that the boat lane, marked by buoys in the summer, should be maintained throughout the year - in order to protect surfers from jet skis.

Tosca. The new bungalow, in the garden of "Tosca" is larger than that on the plans approved by the District Council, which included a garage at the rear. There is now no room for such a garage and the owners started to build one between their new building and the old School House. This was strongly opposed by the Parish Council and an undertaking has been obtained from the planning authorities that they would resist any application for a garage in this position.

Cross Park. The Parish Council made no objection to a planning application for an extension and double garage at "Cross Park".


