
### RINGMORE PARISH NEWSLETTER NO. 72 JULY 1991

### PARISH COUNCIL

Large Vehicles Passing Through Ringmore. On 17 June, representatives of all the interests involved met in Ringmore to discuss the unacceptable traffic problems caused by large vehicles passing through the narrow village lanes. Those present, to assess the position, were Mr. Simon Day, our Devon County Council representative; Mr. Gilbert Sercombe, our South Hams District Council representative; Mr. Frank Palmer, the Chief Executive of S.H.D.C.; Mr. John Eaton, of the Planning Department, S.H.D.C.; Mr. Lavery, of Devon County Council Highways Department; Mr. Downes, the D.C.C. Highways Engineer and P.C. Reynolds, of the Traffic Police. All these high-powered people met Mr. M. White of "Haven Leisure", (the caravan site owners) and three representatives of the Parish Council. cont.over/

# Parish News cont. Large Vehicles Passing Through Ringmore

The visitors were shown the damage caused to property, and roadside trees, by large vehicles and were presented with an illustrated booklet on the problem, prepared by Mr. John Tate. The Parish Council Chairman suggested a possible alternative route for caravans, from the main road to Challaborough and this was subsequently inspected by the visitors. (It is noteworthy that, of the 30 large new caravans which have been sold recently, 26 have been sited in the part of Challaborough which is within Bigbury Parish, so that an approach route through Bigbury would not be unreasonable. Immediately after the site inspection, Mr. Palmer wrote to the Chairman of "Haven Leisure", requesting a meeting to discuss the whole problem. This proposal has been accepted and Ringmore Parish Council has written to Mr. Palmer, thanking him for his help, requesting a copy of the correspondence and asking for representation at the meeting.

Sewage Works. The Parish Council recently wrote to South West Water, seeking information and consultation about the proposed modernisation of Ringmore Sewage Works. South West Water has now undertaken to consult Ringmore Parish Council, when their Study has been advanced.

Ivy Cottage. An Enforcement Notice, requiring the replacement of the V.P.V.C. windows in Ivy Cottage with traditional wooden ones, has now been served on the owners of Ivy Cottage.

Ayrmer Cove. Torrential rain made the beach-cleaning at Ayrmer Cove a much less enjoyable event than usual. Nevertheless, the job was done and the Parish Council is most grateful to the intrepid few who turned up to help.

Post Office. As the anniversary of the setting up of the Community Post Office approaches, the Parish Council has expressed the thanks of the whole village to Rosemary Tate, for the work she has done to make this such a success.

Footpath to Kingston. On 12 June, a wet and windy day, two representatives of Devon County Council, Public Rights of Way Section, met two representatives of Ringmore Parish Council to walk the footpath from Ringmore to Kingston and to discuss discrepancies between the route normally used and the route shown on the Definative Map. It was agreed that the Map will be revised.

Bus Shelter. Elspeth Borne has kindly agreed to take over from Becky Dodds the job of Keeping the bus shelter tidy.

Planning. The Parish Council made no objection to the revised plans for the re-building of "Burgh Island View" at Challaborough.

#### The Rector writes ...

For me, the spot was Capstone Hill in Ilfracombe and the time was longer ago than I care to remember! I went to an open-air service taken by two young men

from the Open-Air Mission. At the end they invited anyone who wanted to talk, to stay behind - I dithered and they offered help. We talked for a long time and no doubt they told me all they knew about following Christ. At that time I could not take in the detail, but the staggering realisation that did come was that God was personal and that I could relate to Him !

Now I wrote last time of the way that God speaks to people - I mean the kind of speaking that brings us to see that God is not just an idea, or a set of rules or even a life-force, but a Person ! It always changes things when personality is added to what is being said - when you find that you are no longer dealing with an "it", but with a person. And that's the way it's got to be with God.

We have a Church Army team coming in August to be with us in this area for a fortnight - we hope to put on things for children, to have their help in our

Sunday services, and special events during the fortnight. But I guess that much of the help they will be to us will come from simply talking ! They are a very straightforward bunch of people, using part of their holiday-time to be with us. At the end of each day we hope they may be invited, in ones and twos, to an evening meal in homes around our patch - please let us know if you would like to share in this hospitality. The dates ? #### GIANT HOGWEED

This plant was introduced into gardens from S.W. Asia about 100 years ago. Having "escaped" it has now become a menace, crowding out native species. It grows up to 12 ft. the sap can cause severe blistering. If anyone comes across this plant it would help if it could be prevented from seeding. More information available. It looks similar to our Cow Parsnip or Hogweed which is common here and grows to about 6 ft.
