### PARISH COUNCIL

**Parish Council Meetings.** The Parish Council is concerned about the fact that members of the public, who wish to discuss particular problems with the Parish Council, often have to wait until the end of a very long meeting, before they have an opportunity to speak. It has been decided that, in future, members of the public will be invited to speak immediately after the discussion of items arising from the minutes of the previous meeting. As a further measure to increase general interest in Council Meetings, the Minutes and Agenda will be displayed on the Notice Board.

Caravan Transportation. A further meeting has been held in Ringmore, between representatives of Haven Warner and of South Hams District Council, to discuss the difficulties encountered when delivering caravans to the site at Challaborough. The Chairman, Mr. Guy Eddy, attended this meeting to explain the problems for Ringmore residents and the damage which had been caused to property in the village. He suggested two alternative routes to Challaborough from the main St. Ann's Chapel/Bigbury on Sea road. A further possible route was also discussed. The meeting was followed by a meeting of Haven Warner representatives with a representative of Bigbury Parish Council.

Representatives of the caravan site undertook to give the whole question of access to Challaborough very serious consideration.

Neighbourhood Watch. The Parish Council is interested in the possibility of setting up a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in Ringmore. It is understood that Bigbury Parish Council is also interested and a meeting will probably be arranged in the Autumn, at which residents of both villages will be able to discuss with the Police the implications of such schemes.

Windows in Ivy Cottage. The Parish Council has been informed that an Enforcement Notice has been served on Midland Bank - the present owners of Ivy Cottage - requiring the replacement of the U.P.V.C. Windows with traditional wooden ones. It is possible that the Bank will appeal against this Notice, but it is hoped that they will decide to comply.

Planning Application for Car Park. An application has been made for a free car park, on land owned by R. Cundy & Sons between St. Ann's Chapel and Bigbury village. It is understood that this car park would be for the use of walkers. Occupancy of Caravans at Challaborough. The Parish Council decided to oppose an application by Haven Leisure to extend caravan occupancy on their larger site from 31 October to 31 December. It was felt that this would represent an unacceptable increase in commercialisation.
