S.H.A.R.E. SOUTH HAMS ANIMAL RESCUE ENTERPRISE

South Hams now has its own Animal Rescue Charity. Earlier this year, a small group of dedicated volunteers formed a Charitable Trust. The name of this Charitable Trust is: South Hams Animal Rescue Enterprise or S.H.A.R.E. purpose of this charity is to rescue dogs and cats that have become homeless. due to their owners' unfortunate circumstances - whatever they may be - and to re-home them with people who will ensure they get the care and love they deserve. This includes stray animals that have been badly treated or neglected. An added boost to S.H.A.R.E.'s publicity came when the B.B.C.'s Theresa Driscoll featured the charity on 'Spotlight' in June. From the time such animals become the responsibility of S.H.A.R.E., they are housed and cared for at Three Acre Boarding Kennels, Totnes, until they are re-homed. All incoming animals are innoculated and where necessary, neutered and are thoroughly checked by a veterinary surgeon. Re-homed animals receive a follow-up visiting service to ensure that both animal and adoptive owner are happy together. S.H.A.R.E. has re-homed over 40 dogs and 30 cats. All this costs money - on average £5 - 00 per day per animal. This money is raised from donations, car-boot sales, jumble sales and dog shows etc. At the moment, the fund raising activities are centered around Totnes, Newton Abbot and Torbay. S.H.A.R.E. needs to spread this fund-raising over a wider area, particularly in the south of the South Hams and is looking for further volunteers to fulfil this Anyone who is interested and requires further information should phone the Chairman - Janet Nash on Totnes (0803) 862127.

PARISH COUNCIL

The item in the monthly Newsletter concerning Parish Council matters will, in future, be written by Mr. John Tate. John Tate will also take over, from Mrs. Sally Davies, the distribution round which was formally covered by Miss Molly Trueman. The other distributors remain as before i.e. Natalie Hilton, Ardene Bennett, Thelma Mann and Pam and Stan Brunskill.

Modbury Plan. In October, the South Hams District Council will discuss the up-dated Modbury Plan. It is expected that the revised Plan will include a paragraph on Challaborough.

Heritage Coast Service. In spite of their undertaking to do so, the Heritage Coast Service has not yet trimmed the footpath to Toby's Point - part of which has become very overgrown. The Parish Council is to remind them about this and also to ask for the vegetation at the edges of the Bridle Path to Ayrmer Cove to be cut back. The cliff erosion at the Challaborough end of the Coastal Path will also be reported.

Police. The Parish Council is to write to the Police Authority to complain about the fact that no action was taken in response to a complaint to Kingsbridge Police Station that an itinerant knife grinder was annoying householders in Ringmore. While the incident was not serious in itself, the Council feels that it might well have been. The police station should have sufficient manpower to attend promptly to such complaints.

Street Sweeper in Modbury. Modbury needs a new street sweeper and anyone interested in this job should inform the Clerk to Ringmore Parish Council. The current rate of pay is £3 - 10p per hour, with a pay rise of 6.4% likely to be implemented in September.

Rabbit Snares. A pet cat in Ringmore has been caught in a snare and was missing for five days while, regrettably, it is legal to set snares in rabbit holes, there is a requirement that these be inspected daily. It is not legal to set snares elsewhere and P.C. Porteous has asked for information about anyone found doing so.

POPPY D1991 APPEAL D1991

Once again we are approaching the time of the year when the Royal British Legion stages its major fund raising events as part of the annual Poppy Appeal. Because there will be no Ringmore newsletter in October, we are bringing it to your attention this month.

The need for fund raising continues as great as ever, with over 100,000 persons receiving benefit of some sort from the Royal British Legion during the last twelve months. There are nearly 250,000 pensioners and widows surviving since the outbreak of the 2nd World War, and as they grow older it is obvious that they may be looking to the Royal British Legion for help of some sort. Coming closer to the present day there have been 620 service personnel killed and over 5000 seriously injured since the troubles flared up in 1969 in Northern Ireland. Since the last Poppy Appeal we have had the Gulf War, where thankfully the casualties were extremely light; and all over the world there are areas of conflict and tension that this country might be required to play its part in, be it no more than maintaining peace whilst problems are settled. This all goes to emphasise the need for the Poppy Appeal for many years to come.

Last year's national collection raised £12,825,873 - 19 which is a highest ever total. We in our three parishes of Bigbury, Kingston and Ringmore raised £1356 - 88p also another record, and which represents well over £1 - 00 per person for our total population of about 1150 persons, which is quite incredible. It is worth noting that if our figures were achieved nationally, the total collection

would raise over £55 million.
