

Weedkiller, Severage, Planning, Caravans and Neighbourhood Watch were the issues dominating the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 3rd March.

Consent for an alternative route for caravans being transported to and from Challaborough is expected on 4th March at the Planning Committee. However, concern was expressed at the continued nuisance and damage experienced during February, in particular damage to Cross Manor Wall, which is 'listed', and the mirror at the Pickwick corner. The Parish Council is to press for the alternative route as soon as possible, and to seek a width-length restriction through the village when that is complete.

Two separate plans, signs for Haven Leisure, and a Mobile Ice Cream Van at Challaborough, were discussed in detail; both were unanimously opposed by the Council. Plans for implementing the Neighbourhood Watch scheme are progressing; watch out for further information regarding stickers!


The main part of the meeting was a presentation by four representatives of South West Water on local sewerage issues. They described the existing sewerage system surrounding Ringmore, Bigbury on Sea and Challaborough, talked of their commitment to environmental issues, explained the need to plan for the next 20 years, and presented options under consideration. Councillors and the six members of the public present received answers to their many questions, and expressed appreciation for an informative presentation.

Lent Lunches


