The Rector writes

This month the General Synod of the Church of England will be voting on the question of ordaining women to the full ministry of the Church. The arguments for and against have waxed long and loud - the important thing is that the Synod (or 'Parliament') may have the mind of Christ when they vote.

Two thoughts have persisted in my understanding of the issue - on the positive side, I have had professional women colleagues in the parishes during most of my ministry and I have found their ministry helpful, distinctive and effective. Then, on the negative side, I have more than a sneaking feeling that women are more conscientious than men, so that if women folk take on full ministry, there will be men who will sit back when they ought to be involved themselves!

Come to think of it - apart from the question of ordination - where would the Church be today without womenfolk?!


