From the Rector ...

During October there were two television debates from the School of Theology in Oxford - the propositions concerned whether the problem of suffering made belief in God impossible and whether science helped belief or not. There were many intelligent speakers and one felt profoundly convinced by their arguments until the next speaker got up and demolished what had just been said! At the end of each programme the final shots were of the assembled company going hammer and tongs at each other in individual debates - there was little evidence of anyone being persuaded one way or the other. The debate continues!



Is there perhaps another factor to be taken into account in the question of belief? It seems that clever argument in itself is not enough - after all, if God is God, we can hardly expect to be big enough to prove or disprove him. On the other hand, if God is God, then it is not only a question of what we think about him, it is also a question of what he thinks about us! More than that, it is a question of what he does about us. The life and work of Jesus Christ is God doing something about us - and then the work of the Holy Spirit is the application of Jesus' work today, in our lives.

I believe, then, there is another factor in the question of faith - and it is a very significant one at that, put most clearly by the Lord Jesus when he said - "You did not choose me, but I chose you"
