### Modbury team Ministry

On Friday, Sept.9th, the Rev.Roderick Withnell is to be licensed by the Bishop of Plymouth to take up his ministry as part of the forthcoming Modbury Team Ministry. The service will be at Loddiswell Church and Roderick's special area of responsibility will be Loddiswell itself, together with East Allington and Woodleigh. Temporary accommodation will be found for the Withnell family -Roderick, Alison and their toddler son - pending provision of a permanent vicarage in Loddiswell. When the scheme comes into force, Roderick will be Team Vicar within it.

The Team Rector will be the Rev.John Cole, present Vicar of Modbury and Aveton Giffard and, in due course, he will be the Incumbent of Bigbury, Ringmore and Kingston as well. We think the Team scheme will be inaugurated in November this year and, in the meantime, we continue to plan for the united group of parishes.

In negotiating the scheme we managed to get the house, here at Ringmore, retained as a "house-for-duty" i.e. available to a retired clergyman in return for Sunday duty and a limited amount of pastoral work. That has been my position since my retirement in April last, and Doreen and I hope to see the Team established before moving on into full retirement. We also hope to see many people sharing the ministry in the days to come, and in this connection, it is encouraging to have Michael Tagent, an experienced Lay Reader, and his family, now permanent residents in our district.

### NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 23rd JULY 1994

Seven members of the public attended the meeting in addition to six Councillors.

\* NATIONAL TRUST - Mr Raeder and Mr Stone attended the meeting from the National Trust. The following items were discussed:

.1 The car park and access road had been delayed because of planning issues but should be completed by Easter 1995.

.2 Work on the boundary fencing was now complete, work on internal fencing and walling could take up to five years to complete.

.3 Councillors made a number of suggestions regarding the plans for the farm building including siting, drainage and sileage which were agreed by Mr Raeder.

.4 Councillors made the strongest protest about the use of Ayrmer Cove for a B-B-Q by a firm of solicitors which had been allowed to take cars to the Cove and whose use of a coach had also caused a traffic hold-up for half an hour in the village

### \* PLANNING:

- the proposal to provide an all weather bowling green at Haven was rejected by SHDC.

- Councillors did not object to a renewal of plans at Higher South Langstone.

### \* LOCAL GOVERNMENT REVIEW -

A green leaflet should have been distributed to every household by the Local Government Commission (some households at Challaborough had not received theirs which was being looked into) - you can send in your view by 26th September. The council agreed to defer its decision until the next council meeting because public meetings have been arranged for 15th September at St Ann's Chapel and 19th September at Aveton Gifford - both at 7.30pm - everyone is invited.

## MEMORIES OF RINGMORE, by Dorothea Carson Terry (nee Triggs)

A family named Roll occupied the "New Inn". They had a daughter named Blanche Johns (as she had a different surname she had perhaps been married). Blanche ran the village shop which was in a corner of "New Inn" and very small. The first cottage on the left up the hill opposite "New Inn" was occupied by Polly Bardens and the attached cottage by Karen Coaker. Polly had an orchard immediately opposite. I cannot remember a husband or children with Polly.

Further up the hill going up opposite the pub, a lane led off to the right. The first house in the lane was occupied by Doctor Miles who had a surgery at Modbury. In the next cottage on the opposite side of the lane lived a family called Luckraft and he did all the threshing for the farms for miles around. Further up again where the hill meets the main Challaborough road (270 on the map) [on the cover of the booklet 'A Walk Round the Village of Ringmore' published by the Ringmore Historical Society and available from the Post Office and the "Journey's End" - Ed] the cottage there was named "Challaborough Cottage" and a freeman lived there who was the village carrier and had a daughter Mrs Medway living with him. His son George married a Lady Fortescue who had a house at Bigbury or Bigbury-on-Sea. She died in childbirth and is buried in Ringmore churchyard. The carrier also had another daughter who married Farmer Snale of "Marwell Farm".

Where Mrs Lock lives I believe was three cottages. There were two of them occupied by Bardens, and Triggs the carpenter in the third. Almost opposite was the village carpenter's shop with Ern Farley then as a young apprentice. In the big house called "The Cottage" (265) there was a family named Lyne who were Canadians. Around (266) there were four small cottages. In the first were the Miller family, second the Bardens, third Tom Farley (a brother of Dick). I can't remember who was in the fourth.
