


INTER PARISH QUIZ

At the February meeting, presided over by Margaret Wood, it was decided to have another Safari Supper in the summer, especially as the evening was such a success last year.


We are looking forward to our trips to see "The Pirates of Penzance" at Plymouth's Theatre Royal in April and "Out of the Rubble" in May.



One member of the public attended the meeting in addition to five Councillors.

* TRAFFIC CALMING

Clls. Eddy, Tate, Bennett and Mc Cabe had met Paul Marshall from Devon County Council earlier in the day to discuss a variety of rumble devices. Councillors agreed to proceed with a number of silver/grey rumble strips which do not protrude too high thus being safe for cyclists but cause a vibration to vehicles. This will cost less than £500 and costs will be shared between the Parish Council and Devon County Council.

* PLANNING

The council considered an application for continued use of Auglen Fell and recommended continued use for a five year period.

* ANNIVERSARY

No suggestions had so far been received to celebrate 100 years of the Parish Council.

* HEDGE CUTTING

It was agreed to arrange for the hedges to be cut down Challaborough Hill early in July.


