RBL VE MEMORIAL REDEDICATION SERVICE

A bugler will be in attendance, the Memorial unveiled and wreaths laid.


Westcountry TV and the Kingsbridge Gazette have been invited.

NOTES FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 18th APRIL 1995

Two members of the public attended the last meeting of the present council in addition to six Councillors.

* THE NEW COUNCIL

Nine nominations had been received for the seven places on Ringmore Parish Council therefore there would be an election on 4th May.

* TRAFFIC CALMING

Councillors had received numerous comments regarding the traffic calming strips which were not as effective as had been hoped. The Chairman had contacted Mr Marshall of DCC who had agreed to a further meeting and would monitor the situation over the summer.

* PLANNING

The two applications for the rebuilding of a conservatory at the Captain's House and improvements at Lower Manor Farm had been approved by SHDC.

* FINANCE

Approval was given to make a contribution of £35 towards the costs of producing the display on Ringmore by the Historical Society

* CHLORINATION

A representative from South West Water had visited various properties in Ringmore to sample the water supply. On the day in question the water was in good condition! However, SWW do wish to take samples when there are problems with chlorination. * BEACH CLEAN

The Council wish to thank the 28 people who turned out for the Ayrmer Cove BEACH CLEAN on Saturday 8th April. A large fire destroyed most of the rubbish, the rest was removed for disposal.

* MODBURY PRIMARY SCHOOL

Concern was expressed that the reception class would consist of 37 pupils. It was agreed to refer this matter to Angela Carson.

* PLAY FACILITIES

Cll Batten suggested the council explores the provision of play facilities. It was agreed that he look into the matter further.
