The Minister writes:

Churchwarden. As you may know, Reg Trant resigned from office at the end of December. This was as planned, in order to give us time to find a successor before the Annual Meeting on March 20. This is not going to be easy, because Reg leaves the post after a distinguished service of many years, and his contribution to the life of our church – and beyond – has been immense. He has asked me "not to make a fuss" of his resignation, so I will obey my Churchwarden! There is no obvious successor, male or female, so a lot of prayer and thought will have to be invested in the search. This is not my appointment, but a joint effort. So please keep me in the picture and help try to find a suitable successor.

Festival of Light. This Service at Eleven on February 1 is envisaged as a replacement for the Christingle Service – at least for this year – which we felt had got stereotyped and needed a new format. As February 2 has been for centuries the day on which we remember the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, in many churches referred to as "Candlemas", we have decided to think about Simeon's a light to lighten the Gentiles on this first Sunday in February. We are in process of devising an appropriate form of service for young and old, to which you are warmly invited.

Lent Course. Under the title "Shipping Lanes: Charting a Course through Lent", we are going to look at the "-ships" in our common life (fellowship, worship, stewardship and so on). These will be on Monday evenings, beginning on March 2, in Ringmore Parish Room, led by members of our Team Ministry (parallel evenings will be in Modbury and Aveton Gifford). Details are still being worked out; posters and leaflets will be available as soon as possible.

Team Rector. On Sunday, January 25, John Cole announced his impending move from Modbury to Alne and Brafferton in the Archdiocese of York. His last Sunday in the Team will be Easter Day. This may well have implications for the rest of the Team parishes during the vacancy. More news probably next month.


WOMEN IN THE COMMUNITY

Under the heading 'Save Our Village Shops' the February edition of THE FIELD mentions some statistics which might be of interest. A report, based on a survey of 9000 parishes and published by the Rural Development Commission, shows that 40% of England's parishes have no shop or post office and 75% have no daily bus service. Sounds familiar?

According to the Village Retail Services Association there are 3,500 villages which may lose their shop or post office (if you work out the figures, only 1900 are not under threat). It is possible to obtain grants for shops serving less than 3000 people provided that the village is within one of 26 scheme areas. Information can be obtained from ViRSA on 01935 891614. Meeting: Tuesday 20th January 1998 Present: 6 Councillors, Mr Paul Marshall (Divisional Director, Devon County Highways) and 12 members of the public.

Traffic

Speed & Parking problems: The concern of a number of residents were put to Mr Marshall who endeavoured to explain exactly what some of the measures proposed would entail and how they may alter the whole character of the village if they were implemented. For example: the imposition of a 20mph speed limit would involve signs, perhaps illuminated, and maybe street lighting and other measures necessary to ensure that all precautions were taken to make sure that it was safe for drivers as well as pedestrians.

Further discussions will take place when the exact locations of the problem have been identified and speed readings with a radar gun have been taken.

Parking obstructions: Where there may be a danger to persons or property, e.g. an ambulance or a fire engine cannot reach their destination, he suggested calling the police who, if necessary, would tow the offending vehicle away.

Re-surfacing of roads

Mr Freeman noted that the level and camber of recent tarmacing, in certain places, did not allow the water to drain away effectively. A letter has been sent to the appropriate authority to rectify the situation.

Rocky Path

A copy of a letter from DCC concerning the surfacing of Rocky Path has been forwarded to the Historical Society.

Tree Planting

The Council hopes to have a tree planted this year behind the bus shelter but as it is understood the ground is infested with Honey-fungus, a very large hole will need to be dug and then lined and filled with fresh soil. Advice is being sought from Mr Robin Toogood, the Heritage Environment Officer.

Next Meeting

Unless it is deemed necessary, there will not be a meeting in February. The next council meeting will therefore take place on Tuesday 24th March at 7.00pm.

The Annual Parish Meeting, to which members of the public are cordially invited, will be held on Tuesday 22nd April at 7.00pm






