

The application by the Parish Room Committee for Lottery funds has been successful! Credit is due to Yvonne Sheppard for having put together the necessary paperwork. This good news for Ringmore will enable the committee to begin the long process of refurbishment. The hall has not been over used in recent years and this has created a difficult situation for the PCC. Should money be spent on a facility which is relatively unused? There is still a finite limit to the demand for use but there is a will and enthusiasm to promote the hall and this would not succeed without some remedial work being done. The Grant is a great start! There is a comprehensive report on the committee's activities inside.

Guy Eddy has continued his research into the possibility of planting giant Sequoia trees to mark the Millennium which has revealed an initial lack of keenness by the NT but Guy is undaunted.

Ringmore has its own SCRABBLE champion . . . . from Bigbury! The competition at the Journey's End produced some close finishes and much enjoyment. Also, the JE supported the Devon Air Ambulance with a Darts Marathon which raised in excess of £300.







National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children Annual Report of the Modbury and District Branch Although our group is called Modbury and District, the membership is widespread. Members come from Bigbury, Easton, Ringmore, Modbury, Ermington and even lyybridge, where our Chairman emigrated some four years ago.

We have had another successful fund-raising year and we are amazed how constantly the support comes in. Our funds go to National HQ and then back to Plymouth.

Plymouth HQ underwent considerable changes last year, particularly in the field of the Child Protection Team. Apart from providing the Child Protection Register Service for Devon Social Services and offering family risk assessment to families and children, the Plymouth Child Witness Support Project has been developed. This covers Devon and Cornwall. Fifteen new Child Witness Supporters have been trained. They provide help for children faced with often a difficult and traumatic court appearance and thus making it easier for the child.

The committee ran four major functions in 1997. They were delighted to receive donations from the Yealmpton Duck Race and the concert given at Christmas in Modbury by the Lupridge Singers. With the addition of private donations, monies from collecting boxes have enabled us to send over £3000 to National HQ.





The Ringmore Parish Room Committee is delighted to announce that it has been awarded a grant of £4995 by the National Lottery Charities Board. The grant will be used to refurbish the room which includes heating installation, renewal of the cloakrooms, stage alterations, fire equipment and disabled access. Work will start as soon as possible. The building is being used on a regular basis by a number of different groups including the newly formed Short Mat Bowls group, children's Friday Club, Step Aerobics group and the Church Choir as well as for private and fundraising functions.

The RPR committee and the Ringmore PCC will consider the implications of a change in ownership for the future of the hall and welcome comments from people who came along to hear Kathleen or could not make it on the day.



# EWITTENINW Z COULIUNED

Further to January's item on trees for the Millennium and in response to several favourable comments, I have made some follow-up enquiries.

I have spoken to Mr Alex Raeder, Land Agent for the Natural Trust, about the possibility of planting on NT land. He said that the NT would look favourably on any plan to plant indigenous broadleaf trees but to plant nonnative species would, almost certainly, not be approved. He agreed that to plant caks or the like would not be making a very bold statement. However we have that to fall back on if other avenues fail.

There are other sites that are being considered in the Parish and I am hoping to get an SHDC Environment representative down to advise us shortly. From my phone conversation, I got the impression that the District Council were in favour of Millennium tree planting.

I have spoken to Endsleigh Gardens and they assure me that saplings could be provided without much difficulty.

So far no commitments have been made but it might be time to reach a decision whether or not to take it further.
