Holidays

The root of words and sayings in our language are often lost in the mists of time. "Touch wood" is an idle and useless waste of words, a superstition that has no meaning today. It derived from corrupt so called holy men wandering around the land with splinters that they claimed were parts of "the true cross of Jesus". It has been said that if all these so called relics were assembled in one place the cross made from them would have exceeded the size of the Eiffel Tower.

In a similar fashion we have forgotten that "Goodbye", is an abbreviation of "God be with you" and that "Holiday" has a root in "HOLY DAY". Back in the time when most of this land had no thought of travelling miles for a rest from work, the celebrations and great Christian festivals were times for genuine rejoicing. That holy aspect of rest and recreation is in our design by the God who made us and loves us wanting the best for us. We are commanded to have a Sabbath day of rest, and if we look at the roots of Christianity there were also longer periods set apart for prayer, worship and celebration. It would be good for each one of us to use any space we might have for those purposes.

My own trip towards Christianity was hugely boosted by surfing late one evening, the waves were perfect. A small but good swell was running, with a light off-shore breeze holding up the wave face for excellent rides. The sun setting behind me, it was a north coast Devon location, made beautiful rainbow coloured lights in the spray from the top of the waves. It was almost as if someone nudged me and said "Who made it?"

Once again this year to aid those who might enter our three Churches, we have put quiz sheets (with answers) at Bigbury, Kingston, and Ringmore, and visitors could include local folk who have rarely visited the neighbouring Parishes! The quizzes are partly about the buildings, but also about other interests that might help holiday/holy day reflection.

One special event this month is our special Bigbury Commemoration Service at 3.00 p.m. on Sunday the 12th. This is a special Service which has proved very helpful, especially for those who have suffered bereavement in the short or medium term. A time to remember those who have died, but also to support and encourage those left behind. We have sent written invitations to those folk who we know from the last few years funerals, and from headstones in the Churchyard. If we missed you we are sorry, but everyone is very welcome to come. There will be refreshments afterwards in the Memorial Hall at St Anne's Chapel.

In closing to all our visitors enjoy your time in this beautiful area. To all our local residents do come and visit the Churches. On a Sunday would be great, but they are also open for you in daylight hours on all other days.



OPEN SESSION

Mr.T.Smith raised the question of the mound of earth opposite End Bohemia Cottage stating that the removal of this was a good idea. The Chairman replied by stating that he could possibly answer this question when Mr.Mumford arrived. He also asked what the conditions were on the recently granted planning permission for the Ringmore Parish Room windows. The clerk read them out, i.e. The development to which this permission relates must be begun not later than the expiration of three years beginning with the date on which the permission is granted (21st May 2009)

MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

The Minutes of the May meeting were signed as a true and correct record.

MATTERS ARISING

Notice Board - The new notice board is to be put in position shortly. This has been donated by Mr & Mrs Lambell to which Parish Council would like to say thank you.

1st Aiders - The Chairman reported that the list of contacts will, hopefully, be published in the next newsletter. Also the names will be printed on a fridge magnet.

Clock - The clock has been fitted back in the tower within a suitable weatherproof box. The clock is working correctly but is not yet striking. We are awaiting Francis Jarvis to visit and check the circuit.

Parking - Item to be carried over to the next meeting.

W.MUMFORD

After the elections the conservatives have overall control of Devon County Council and there will be a number of changes in the administration. The Boundary Commission is still proceeding with recommendations to the Government by the 15th July. He was asked if Highways could help to remove the mound of earth opposite End Bohemia Cottage, he will inspect this and report back. He was also asked if it would be possible to fit a mirror at Harratton Cross, although they are opposed to fitted mirrors he would make enquiries. He did mention that Highways were in the process of cutting grass and hedges in this particular area.

BRIAN CARSON

South Hams and the Princes Foundation Trust have done a survey of areas where it might in the future be possible to build houses. In the areas designated local residents were given the opportunity to air their views on whether the housing would be acceptable.

His threatening behaviour and unwelcome media attention when not needed created more problems but eventually he was convicted in 3 separate courts on 3 different charges of dog abuse.

Sadly, he did not get the custodial sentence he deserved but a lifetime ban from keeping and controlling dogs along with a hefty fine. I was proud to be the first RSPCA inspector to successfully gain such a conviction.





What a tremendous success the Flower Festival held 19 – 21st June in Ringmore turned out to be, showing Ringmore at its very best. Lots of people participated in many different ways and the lovely flower arrangements were produced both by individuals and the many various village organisations. Polished performances by both the Village Singers and the Children's Choir ensured the evening continued on its successful way. Wine and nibbles were served during the interval with all the wine being kindly donated by Steve Chapman of Friar Tuck's Fish and Chips at Challaborough.

Refreshments were available throughout the weekend in the WI Hall. Delicious cakes, ploughman's lunches and superb cream teas were served by Jane Baker's willing band of helpers. The Plant Stall, in the WI garden, organised by Jinny McCabe also did very brisk business.

The Celebration Service on the Sunday evening brought the Festival to a close. The church was once again packed, and the scents from the flower arrangements filled the air. The Antenna has been repositioned to enable the lead from it to enter the underside of the box. Yogurt & Saffron Marinated Chicken Skewers

Serves 4 Preparation Time-10 minutes

800g Boneless skinless Chicken thighs or breast cut into bite-sized pieces

200ml natural yogurt

2tsp finely grated ginger

4 garlic gloves crushed

2 large pinches of saffron threads

1 tsp ground cinnamon

1 tsp chilli powder

1 red pepper, cut into bite-sized pieces

1 yellow pepper, cut into bite-sized pieces

6 tbsp finely chopped basil leaves

10 tbsp good quality mayonnaise

 Place the chicken in a large mixing bowl. Stir in the natural yogurt, grated

ginger, garlic, saffron, ground cinnamon and chilli powder, season well and pour over the chicken. Toss to coat well, cover and marinate in the fridge for 6-8 hours or overnight if time permits.

 Thread the chicken and peppers onto 8-12 skewers. Place on a grill rack and cook over a barbecue or under a medium grill for 10-12 minutes, turning the skewers once, until the chicken is cooked through.

Mix together the chopped basil and mayo until well blended—season well and serve on the side.

Barbecued Sesame Seafood

Serves 4 Preparation time—15 minutes

Serve this tasty seafood with a tossed green salad for a healthy meal.

2 tsp sesame oil

2 tsp lime juice

2 garlic gloves, crushed

2 tsp chopped fresh ginger

1 small chilli, seeded and sliced

2 tbsp sesame seeds

4 boneless fish fillets

12 king prawns, peeled and de-veined, tail intact

8 scallops

Olive oil spray

2 tbsp chopped parsley to garnish

1 lemon, cut into wedges to garnish

 Combine the sesame oil, lime juice, garlic, ginger, chilli and sesame seeds in a shallow dish. Add the fish, prawns and scallops and turn to coat in the marinade. Cover and leave to marinate in the fridge for 15 minutes.

Spray the barbecue hotplate lightly with olive oil and heat. Remove the seafood from the marinade and place

on the barbecue plate, turning once.

The fish fillets usually cook in 5-10 minutes, depending on their thickness, while the prawns and scallops cook in 4-6 minutes. Brush the seafood with the marinade while cooking.

When cooked, place the seafood on a serving platter and garnish with parsley and lemon wedges.

Raspberry & White Chocolate Tart

Serves 8

Preparation time 25 minutes + chilling

For the filling

100ml double cream 250g white chocolate - broken into small pieces Seeds from 2 vanilla pods

375g ready-made shortcrust pastry 300g raspberries Icing sugar to dust Heat cream, chocolate and vanilla in a saucepan over a low heat, stirring until the chocolate has melted. Stir and remove from the heat. Allow to cool, pour into a container and chill in the fridge for 2-3 hours.

2. Set oven to 180 °C/160 °C/Gas 4. Roll out the pastry and line a 35cm x 12cm rectangular, loose-bottomed tart tin. Chill for 30 minutes then line the pastry base with parchment and baking beans and bake blind for 20-25 minutes. Remove the paper and beans and

return to oven for 4-5 minutes then set aside

3. When ready to serve, place the chocolate mixture in a bowl & whisk lightly until soft peaks have formed. Spoon this mixture into the pastry base and top with the raspberries. Dust the tart with icing sugar and serve cut into thick slices. 
