

PANCAKES AND PREPARATION

We have some funny words in the Christian Church! Why do we call it "Lent", when we don't lend anything? And why "Shrove" Tuesday? Pancake Day is much easier to understand.

You won't find the word "Lent" in the Bible. It actually comes from an Old English word meaning "long", and probably refers to the way that the days visibly lengthen in Spring.

The 40 days of Lent, from Ash Wednesday to the day before Easter (excluding Sundays), are traditionally a time for prayer, penitence, almsgiving and self-denial. Which tends to be translated as "what are you giving up for Lent?"

In earlier times, people were forbidden from eating meat, eggs and dairy products during Lent. These had to be used up by the Tuesday, and pancakes became a popular way of doing this. (You can enjoy them this year in Ringmore Parish Room from 10.30 am.) There have been pancake races in Olney, Buckinghamshire, since 1445.

Shrove Tuesday thus became a time for festivities, releasing high spirits before the sombre season of Lent. It was often called "Fat Tuesday" (hence "Mardi Gras"), and celebrated as a carnival day.

But "shrove" is actually the past tense of "shrive" (which also gives us the word "scribe"), and means to absolve. Before the start of Lent, Christians were expected to confess their sins, do penance and obtain absolution.

So Lent is a time to take stock of our lives, a time to ponder on the teachings and work of Jesus Christ, a time to prepare for the triumph of Easter. Locally, there are meetings during Lent in Kingston, Loddiswell and Modbury (see posters for details), so come along and join others as we discuss, read and pray together.

DECLARATION OF PREJUDICAL INTERESTS - M.Hammond B.Lambell (item regarding The Royal British Legion)

OPEN SESSION

Dr. Malcolm Finlay raised concerns regarding the proposed rock armour coastal defence to protect the cliff below 57 Marine Drive. He gave his reasons for objecting to this application as follows – it appears that no proper thought has gone into this planning application, and no adequate survey has been produced – it will have an unacceptable visual impact in an area of outstanding natural beauty – who will own it and be responsible for reinstatement should it move and keeping the structure clear of debris – who will be responsible for any accidents that might occur – the roads that will be used by heavy trucks carrying material for this development are limited in capacity and in a fragile state – before this rock armour is installed the applicants should be able to guarantee that the quality of the surfing wave will not be compromised. Dr. Finlay then asked Parish Council if they would endorse his objections to the planning office.

Mr. S. Purdy stated that following the installation of the drain pipe under Darkie Lane he is most disappointed at the way the exit pipe has been left to drain the water onto his land. Instead of a small pipe being close to the ground it is now a large opening somewhere up the wall which results in water cascading out of the pipe onto his land causing a deep gully. He was led to believe that a drop drain trap would be installed and the water drained away to a nearby well. A letter will be sent to Highways.

MINUTES OF JANUARY MEETING - Signed as correct.

MATTERS ARISING

Avglen Fell Hedge - Address of the owners to be obtained by B. Carson

Kachelo Wall - An e-mail address has been given to contact the owners

Permissive Path to St. Ann's - A planning application by Bigbury has been submitted for removal of part of the hedge. The deeds have been signed by all parties.

Grit Bins - Mr. J. Morrison Highways Engineer has stated that whilst they agree that bins at the top of Challaborough Hill and at Burgh Island View are necessary they do not consider these to be a priority for the limited funding available. Mr. W. Mumford will look into this item on our behalf. It was agreed that should the weather deteriorate and the bins are not in place the Parish Council will arrange to purchase bags of winter grit.

Potholes outside the telephone box - nothing to report from Tor Homes.

Royal British Legion Wreath - a vote was taken as to whether the Parish Council should purchase an annual wreath; 1 Cllr. was in favour, 3 against and 2 abstained.

Parish Room Financing - Nothing to report at present.

Challaborough Planning Applications - Cllr. B. Carson confirmed that when planning applications are received for Challaborough copies will be sent to both Bigbury and Ringmore Parish Councils.

W. MUMFORD

Clir. Mumford stated that from the 28th February, for three weeks, extensive work will take place through Modbury and the road will be closed. The road will be closed from Palm Cross Green to the bend at Walter's Garage. The work will begin at 9.30am to 4.00pm but will be opened for 1 hour each day to allow school buses through. Parts of the road will be open after the first repairs are carried out. Poundwell car park will be accessible to visit the Doctor via Brownston Street.

Budget proposals are to be taken to a full cabinet meeting next week. Extra funding has been made available for rural schools. Some rural bus services have been cancelled and the Fare Car Scheme will be retained but reduced.

B.CARSON

Mr. Carson stated that council tax will remain the same next year as South Hams District has obtained the Government Council Tax Freeze Grant. He stated that refuse bins were being overfilled so that the lids do not shut resulting in the lids being torn off when lifted into the refuse lorries. This is costing £1000 per month to repair broken lids.

People with overfilled bins with lids open will not be emptied as operatives are not allowed to remove or touch contents.

PLANNING

Application 40/0231/11/F Velux rooflights Ohope Barn Higher Manor Farm - No objection

Application 05/2732/10/F Rock armour coastal defence Challaborough. Further to the item under "open session" and the discussion with Dr. Finlay Council agreed to support the objections and send a letter to planning. They also asked Dr. Finlay if he would attend the 3 minute session at Follation House when this plan is discussed, to which he agreed. PARISH PLAN Ringmore Community Emergency Plan – Item on the agenda carried forward to the next meeting. Cluster Meeting – The Chairman reported that this meeting was well attended with many interesting speakers. He then gave a brief outline of what was discussed.

FINANCE - Cheque signed and agreed Cllr..Reynolds £13.20 for petrol used whilst on council business.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS Cllr. Reynolds will be keeping a close eye and regularly check the oil prices. Dates were arranged for skips – 16th April Ringmore – 30th April Challaborough.

Royal British Legion - Village Car Scheme

The Ringmore Branch of the British Legion is looking for ways in which the organisation can actively help the village community.

One such idea under consideration is to instigate a car scheme. This would entail any villager offering their services to become a driver; and using their own car to transport someone to hospital – Derriford, Kingsbridge or the Royal Eye Infirmary. It would be hoped also that the scheme could cover optician and dental appointments.



Ideally, a central person in the village will hold a list of names of drivers who are keen to offer their services. Any villagers then wishing to use the services of this scheme for an appointment would phone the central person to advise them of their appointment date.

They would then be informed who would take them to and from their appointment.

We would wish to stress that this planned new scheme would not encroach upon the existing Modbury Caring drivers scheme which transports people to the Heath Centre in Modbury. The idea is to help and assist villagers to get to other appointments with the minimum of fuss.

News from the National trust Article written by volunteer ranger Katy Holvey

With the days getting longer, and the weather getting very slightly warmer, the National Trust team have been busy running events.

On 18th January the National Trust Rangers ran a photography event in Noss Mayo with the help of photographer Dave Bassett. Dave was teaching those involved how to use and make the most of their cameras, and how to take great, memorable photographs. The weather was ideal and the scenery seemed designed for photography. Rather than just using a camera to point and shoot, Dave Bassett explained how to compose and expose a photo perfectly to capture the image individuals might be aiming for. Participants were inspired by the stunning coastline and the small harbour-side village of Noss Mayo and were able to produce some beautiful images. Another photography event is being run in March, see below for details.

As well as getting arty, the National Trust Rangers have been passing on their hedge laying skills. A Midlands style hedge laying course was run on Sunday 6th February below Snapes Point near Malborough. Hedge laying is an important management technique as it maintains a livestock barrier and creates a great wildlife habitat for birds, insects and mammals. People were really interested in learning how to look after a hedge, and a few were going to go home and lay their own!

As part of the National Trust's Guardianship Scheme a group of 15-16 year old pupils from Plymstock School have been clearing scrub from Wembury Point. Every two weeks they arrive in their minibus and spend a few hours removing and burning gorse from the cliffside. On their last visit they split into two groups to have a competition to see who could clear the most gorse, which meant that they got a huge amount of work done!

Many people, wrongly, worry that their giving disappears into central funds via the "Common Fund" and is wasted on unnecessary administration and hierarchy, but the figures show that the cost of the diminishing number of parish clergy exceeds the total contributions to the "Common Fund". This means the churches are net receivers from the diocese and contribute nothing towards the costs of Bishops, Archdeacons, administration etc. and this is true also for both for the Modbury Team as a whole and for Ringmore




