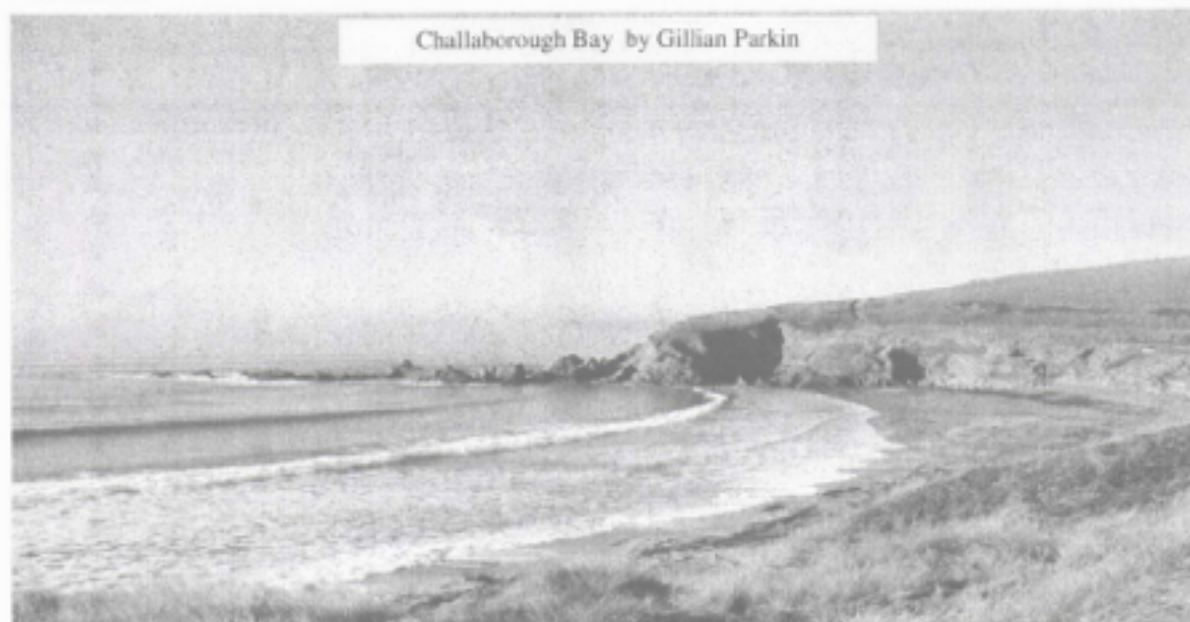

### TIME TO SERVE

The Government wants us to express our views on the A.V. Time was when these letters referred to the Authorised Version of the Bible, which celebrates its 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year, and stands unique in English literature. For many, the A.V. is still the authentic language of Christianity; for others, it is the first in a long line of translations seeking to present God's message in everyday language.

But the Government has something rather different in mind. How will we elect our politicians in future – FPTP (first past the post) or AV (alternative vote)? The referendum is on 5 May, and it certainly is not my place to comment on which way to vote!

The crucial thing about any election, whether Parliament or PCC, is that those who are elected represent the whole electorate, not just those who voted for them. That means acting in the interests of all, and championing the needs of the minority. It is when people feel that their elected leaders don't care about them that trouble starts. Power has to be exercised for the common good – and certainly not for personal gain.

We elect people to serve in various capacities. Indeed, the word "minister" means "servant", and clergy are servants of Jesus Christ called to specific (and onerous!) work. Ministers of the Crown are servants of the people. ("Prime Minister" actually means "Chief Servant", although I suspect that David Cameron would rather not change the title!)

The idea of service runs right through our society from top to bottom; we rely on each other for the goods and services which we need. We may not think of it in such terms, but serving each other is fundamental to our enjoyment. For Christians, this finds its ultimate in the way we serve God, for the other side of that coin is the way God blesses us.

So whichever way we vote on 5 May, let's make sure our own lives reflect a loving concern for others, and a new willingness to serve God and our fellow men and women.

**AIM** Land's End to John O'Groats just for the fun and challenge in a small, home built, open sports car and to raise money for St Luke's Hospice, Plymouth

**WHO** Drs Ann and Mike Oakins, one a doctor of Literature and the other of Medicine and both well into the 'bus pass' era, along with 8-10 other mad individuals who own, and have built, similar cars.

**WHERE AND WHEN** Starting from Land's End on 10<sup>th</sup> July 2011 and hopefully arriving in John O'Groats in 15<sup>th</sup> July 2011 using A and B roads and trying desperately to avoid Motorways. Overnight stops have been arranged in Newport, South Wales; Preston, Lancashire and Kilmarnock and Inverness in Scotland.  
**WHY** We are all car enthusiasts – less so perhaps our partners- who wanted a challenge. We all use our cars in long distance reliability trials, in addition to ordinary road use, and wanted something different to do this summer, out of the trials season.

**WHAT** The cars are all home built kit cars – called Liege. In spite of the Belgian name the kits were made in Evesham and there are now about 40 cars on the road, 5 or 6 of which will be taking part. It has become a tradition that most of them have names. Ours is called Julia and is only the second kit produced. I spent 2 1/2 years building her before she was licensed for the road in 1999 after passing the SVA (Single Vehicle Approval Test which is like a glorified MOT and takes half a day). The donor vehicle for all Liege is a Reliant Robin – so the engine, gearbox and various other parts were transplanted into a new chassis and body. Sounds easy!!

Julia is now in her 12<sup>th</sup> year and has done about 40 000 miles. (You can begin to see some of the knocks). Very early in life she took part in a rally all the way down to Corsica and has since completed many long distance reliability trials which involve off road hill climbing as well as many ordinary road miles. She has only had to retire once with a faulty alternator. Since she only has a small (850cc) engine and a four speed gearbox she does not like Motorways or dual carriageways which is why our chosen route to John O'Groats is on A, B, and unclassified roads including some interesting hills in Devon, Wales and Scotland.

I have wanted an excuse to do an End to End for many years and now the opportunity has arisen. As a member of the Devon Vintage Car Club, whose charity this year, in memory of our President Beryl Friend who died last year, is St. Luke's Hospice, I ask for your support of this much loved local facility.

## NATIONAL TRUST



With the fantastic weather South Devon has been having over the last couple of weeks, it seems as though summer is well and truly on its way. It highlights just how stunning the coast is in this area, and how important it is that people are able to get out and about to appreciate it! Over the last month the Rangers have been busy beginning to make preparations for the summer season; footpath cutting and making preparations at the car parks.

On the 27<sup>th</sup> of April, the rangers held a beach clean at Ayrmer cove, Ringmore. A group of keen local people joined us for the morning, it was great to talk to the local residents and see just how much Ayrmer is loved by the people who regularly use it. The morning was part of a South West beach clean event run by the National Trust to understand what sort of litter is found on our beaches; whether it is from passing ships, fishing vessels or people on the beach. We managed to collect a large amount of information which will be added to the Marine Conservation Society countrywide database. I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to all those who joined us.

Over the past few years the ponds at Scobbiscombe Farm have been part of a nationwide chytridiomycosis survey. This disease is believed to be responsible for the decline of newts and toads in North America and Australia. Last week, the pond at Scobbiscombe was re-surveyed in order to enable scientists to better understand the nature of the disease. Over the space of a couple of hours, with nets in hand, we attempted to catch as many newts and toads as we could find so they could be swabbed to see if they carried the disease. After an afternoon of hunting we only managed to find 13 out of the 30 desired newts, but these results will still play an important part of the survey.

With the weather improving and the sun shining, I hope to see you out and about enjoying the breath taking views along this wonderful section of coastline.

Mr.John Bavistock (Chairman SHDC) stated that he has tried to attend as many Parish Council Meetings as possible. Parish Council's are a very important part of the structure and probably will have more say in the near future under new proposals.

SHDC have cut costs by reducing 4 – 2 Chief Executives and 15 – 7 District Managers.

Dr.Finlay informed council that he would be attending the planning committee meeting regarding the Rock Armour Coastal Defence application to speak against this proposal.

He also mentioned that at times cars were being parked on the road down to Journey's End when their car park is full, this causes hazards for residents and the possibility of emergency vehicles. The Chairman explained the reason for the percentage increase in Ringmore Parish Council Tax is due to the number of people paying into the Tax Base being less than in previous years.

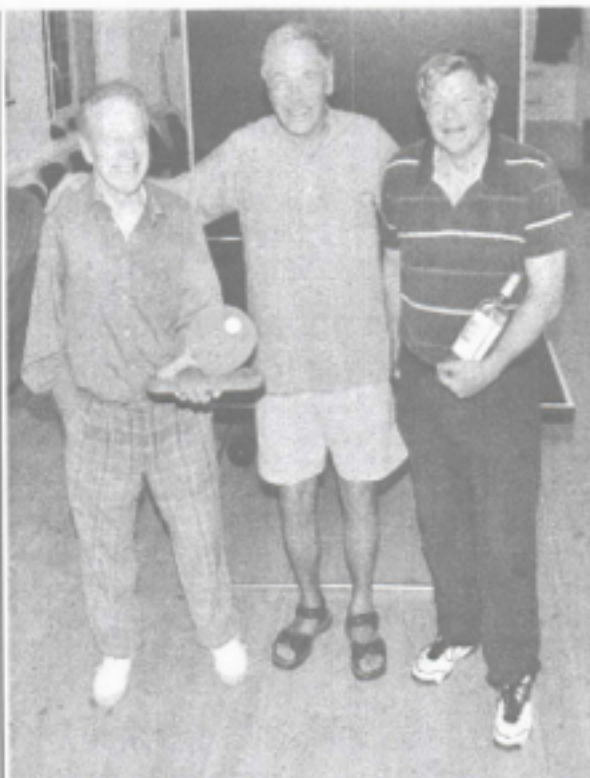
