

Neighbourhood Watch Notice

Several people in the village have been getting unwanted phone calls from sales people, some of which are clearly from outside the UK. Occasionally the caller has been very persistent and sometimes aggressive. If you have not already done so you can sign up for the Telephone Preference Service 0845 070 0707 or www.tpsonline.org.uk, This should stop most of the cold calling double glazing and other companies from contacting you, but it does not stop calls from overseas. The best way to deal with these is to put the phone down when you realise it is not a call you want. Some people get distressed by such calls, but you don't have to listen to them. Most of the bank scams are on the internet, and should never be responded to. Your bank has no need to ask for your details, they already have them. If you get a call purporting to be from your bank, ring the bank to inform them.



Parish Room Update

The Parish Room roof has now been renovated to stop the ingress of water and improve thermal insulation. Thanks to MJ & JA Pitts' top team of Tom and Sam, the work was completed during our brief spell of sunny weather. When the walls are painted, this phase of the work will be finished and we start saving for the next improvements. To improve use of the hall the storage shed has been rebuilt and now houses the tables and chairs.

The money for the re-roofing was split 50/50 from fund raising and a grant from the South Devon Coastal Local Action Group who use money from the EU, DEFRA, South West RDA and South Hams Council. Our fund raising included monies from the Sustainable Community Locality Fund of South Hams District Council facilitated by District Councillor Bryan Carson and Devon County Council's Locality Budget Award arranged by Councillor William Mumford. Our thanks go to these sources together with all the people locally who have contributed generously in so many ways. Collection boxes are still coming in for which we are very grateful.



HISTORICAL SOCIETY



19 members took part in the Society's summer outing to Torre Abbey on 8 June, a beautiful sunny day. The Abbey is spectacularly sited on the sea front in Torbay. It was established in 1196 as a Christian Monastery (the monks certainly knew how to pick their sites), and became one of the wealthiest in the country. Henry VIII ordered the demolition of the church section in the 1530s, and the remainder was converted to a private house, which became home to the Cary family until the 1930s, when it was sold to the local council.

It is a great warren of a place, and also houses a large art collection which features many well-known artists. We were given a detailed guided tour (some of us, yearning for our lunch, found it a touch over-detailed), followed by lunch in the restaurant.

We then wandered around the lovely gardens and magnificent glass house which have been established behind the Abbey within the walls of the demolished church.

If you haven't been, I think we would all say that it's well worth a trip, and certainly gave us a very enjoyable day out.

To follow on from this meeting there will be a community workshop on Wednesday 6th July at 12,15pm

Parish Council's New Project – After further discussion the project of making the area around the bus shelter a feature was considered to be a good idea. However, the Chairman stated that this should not be just a Parish Council decision but should involve parishioners and their suggestions. An appendix will be prepared to be added to the next newsletter. An earlier suggestion was to produce a booklet showing all the footpaths in the parish, this may now happen.

NATIONAL TRUST



As spring turns into summer, and the grasses turn golden in the summer sunshine, the Ranger team are busier than ever managing the south Devon coastline. With the opening of a new footpath, national farm open days and general maintenance to be carried out there is lots to be done.

On Sunday the 12 June it was Open Farm Day. This is a national event whereby farmers open their gates to the public. For the second year running Wilf Walters of Scobbiscombe farm took part, and although the weather was rather miserable, it was the perfect opportunity to unveil the new permissive footpath out towards Hoist Point. A couple of dedicated locals joined us to open and be the first to walk the new footpath. It was a great opportunity to meet the local community, and to see their fondness of the countryside.

The team have also been busy making preparations for the summer season as it is one of our busiest times of the year. Our events programme really kicks off; with overnight wild camping, canoeing on the Yealm and Salcombe Estuaries and off road cycling on the rugged East Prawle coast! Look out for dates at the end of this article! It is also a busy time of year for involvement with school groups; we have two guardianship groups who join the rangers to learn more about the countryside and wildlife in their local area. It is a great chance for children to explore the outdoors and learn to appreciate what is found on their doorstep.

We are proud of the on-going support we have from the locals in Ringmore, who regularly clean the beach and carry out checks in the area. It is great to have this help, and wonderful to have people willing to keep this stunning section of coastline free of litter. With summer setting in, I am sure I will see more of you out and about around Scobbiscombe and Ayrmer cove enjoying the weather and the fantastic views. If not, then perhaps I will meet you at one of our exciting up and coming events!




