Terry Valiant writes:

The Bible tells us that Christ is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end, the first and the last. And, at the beginning of our Christian Year, is Advent – an arrival, a coming into being. It means we're looking forward to something, in this case to Christmas – the time of the birth of Jesus, the Son of God.

Have you noticed children as it gets near their birthdays? Everything builds from about 2 weeks before the event. They wonder what presents they will get. They start thinking about parties and who to invite. The older ones will start dropping hints. They start getting excited.

This is what Advent is about; anticipation and excitement. It gives us the time to think about what Christmas really means. It gives us the opportunity to look forward to it. It enables us to grow more excited as the time draws near. Not excited by the secular conventions that surround us: you know, buying expensive presents just to impress, sending cards to people you never think about the rest of the year, stringing 6 million fairy lights over your house and topping it off with a large plastic, floodlit Father Christmas – all in the best possible taste of course.

Christmas isn't about bigger and better, it's about the birth of a baby and being quiet. It's not about receiving, but giving. Advent means looking forward with anticipation and hope, not just to Christmas but to the greatest gift of all – the gift of Jesus coming into our world, and into our hearts and lives. Now THAT'S exciting!

At the beginning of the summer the new permissive footpath at Scobbiscombe was opened to provide an alternative and less arduous route from Hoist Point to Wonwell beach. The walk gives beautiful views of Burgh Island and Bigbury Bay and access to the secluded beaches of Westcombe and Hoist Beach. This stretch of coastline is truly spectacular and is a home to a wide range of wildlife, including the nationally rare Cirl Bunting.

Over at Ringmore Orchard volunteer ranger, John Reynolds, has organised a community group that will carry out maintenance work and improvements that will restore the orchard and enable the trees to grow and flourish. We hope these changes to the Orchard will encourage more people to visit the site. Many people, wrongly, worry that their giving disappears into central funds via the "Common Fund" and is wasted on unnecessary administration and hierarchy, but the figures show that the cost of the diminishing number of parish clergy exceeds the total contributions to the "Common Fund". This means the churches are net receivers from the diocese and contribute nothing towards the costs of Bishops, Archdeacons, administration etc. and this is true also for both for the Modbury Team as a whole and for Ringmore.

Royal British Legion

Firstly, our Branch would like to express our utmost thanks to those of you that supported our recent events. The Film Night, held at Bigbury Memorial Hall raised £500 and the Auction, which was held at the Journey's End raised a massive £4650. Combined with the collection for the Poppy Appeal, our total so far for this year is just over £9000. With another 10 months to go, we are well on target to exceed our last years total of £9507.07 which was a record for our Branch.

Where does all this money go? Well, the welfare work of the RBL continues to expand and diversify as the welfare needs of the population evolve. The current number of potential beneficiaries for welfare services is estimated at 9.5 million. The mission of the RBL is to reach out to the 500,000 who are in the greatest need.

The RBL have also pledged their biggest-ever single donation, £50m, to the Defence Recovery Capability. This will be used to fund the operating costs of the four PRC's in the UK and a Personnel Recovery Facility in Germany. It will also be used to create and operate the Legion's Battle Back Centre, which will be located in the West Midlands and will use adaptive sport and adventurous training to aid recovery.

In addition, here are a few examples of other things the RBL help out with: Compensation advice, inquest advice, benefits and money advice, help with disability benefits, Immediate Needs Grants, jobs and careers, help with starting a business, care homes, companionship at home and in hospital, overseas support and recovery centres for serving personnel. The list is endless, as is the RBL's commitment to supporting ex-servicemen and women, those still serving and their dependants.

Our 'little' Branch is always looking for new members. You don't need to have served in the Armed Forces, membership is open to everyone. If you are interested you can contact Mark Bolam, Branch Secretary, on 810766. Our next meeting will take place at The Journey's End in Ringmore at 19:30hrs on Wednesday December 7th 2011. As always, everyone is more than welcome to attend.

Finally, all that remains is to wish everyone a safe and Happy Christmas and New Year on behalf of our Branch.




CHRISTMAS BAZAAR

Carpet

A plea to all in and close to the village on mains drainage.

May I ask that everyone on mains drainage is very careful as to what they allow to enter the sewer system.? Four times now in three years the manhole in our garden has surcharged following the blockage of the sewer which happens to cross the back garden. The result has been unpleasant to say the least and means South West Water have to attend to clear up (as best they can) the not inconsiderable mess and we have lost a large number of plants. Nearly every time the cause is either fat or rags. The sewer is small in diameter about 4 inches and not in the best condition, with uneven surfaces and rough joins, so soon starts to block if too much comes down. A new sewer is out of the question hence the plea for all to be aware and careful. Thank you.
