## A QUESTION OF SERVICE

On 6<sup>th</sup> February 2012, Her Majesty The Queen celebrates 60 years on the throne. In that time she has seen 12 Prime Ministers, from Winston Churchilll to David Cameron. Much has changed since 1952. Satellites, mobile phones, digital cameras, iPads – the list of new inventions and products is endless. MDF board, for example, dates from the 1980s; the Channel Tunnel was opened in 1994.

Throughout this time, Queen Elizabeth's conduct and service have been an example to all, and the esteem in which she is held is testimony to her dedication. We thank her and join the cry "God save the Queen".

Today's society can sometimes sneer at the ideas of duty and service, yet examples are all around us. Soldiers serve their country; shopkeepers serve their customers. Young people may serve an apprenticeship; others may serve on a committee. We rely on the work of civil servants (even though we grumble when things are not what we want), and use servers to manage our computer data. The underlying themes are of discharging duties and of doing things which benefit others.

Church services are times when worshippers recognise their duty and service to God. At least, that is how it should be. In some churches (not, of course, ours!) people act as though God were involved in running a chain of social clubs, places where they can go for the enjoyment when they feel like it.

True worship is where people acknowledge that God is their Creator, the King of kings. Christians are called to be servants (literally, 'slaves') of God's Son, Jesus Christ. He is their Lord and Master, and they serve him willingly. Christianity is about taking every opportunity to proclaim his message of love and salvation by word of mouth and the quality of our lives. That message – the message of the Christmas angels – is to let Jesus be at the centre of life, and to know his blessings, today and for ever.

#### OPEN SESSION

Mr.R. Wood reported that Bigbury Parish Council have received new plans for Beach Down Bungalows in Challaborough. He asked the Council to enquire why the plans had not been forwarded to this Council as agreed with S.H.D.C. The clerk to enquire.

MINUTES OF NOVEMBER MEETING - Signed as correct.

#### MATTERS ARISING

Bus Shelter - Parish Council, after discussing the quotations received for refurbishing the bus shelter, agreed on A.M.King & Sons to carry out this work.

New Litter Bin - Cllr.Reynolds reported that this is due to arrive sometime this week.

Parish Room Sycamore Tree – Works to trees in a conservation area, application No. 40/0114/12/TCA, have been received to fell the sycamore tree and crown lift the copper beech. Parish Council had no objections.

The Parish Room Committee have appointed a new Chairman following Mr A McCarthy's resignation.

Addresses of second home owners – South Hams District Council are unable to supply this information as personal details such as names and addresses are exempt under Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act so as not to contravene the Data Protection Act 1998.

Councillor co-option - No nominees have come forward.

News letter editorial – There has been no response to the request for someone to assist the Editor, with a view to take on this role. Another item will be placed in the newsletter. Parish Council wished to thank the Editorial team for all their efforts. The newsletter is on a strong financial basis. Cllrs. will try to encourage a suitable person to join the team..

#### B.CARSON

South Hams District Council budgets will be under discussion this week. Another matter under debute is to introduce car parking charges in areas where they are now presently free parking. South Hams are still working with West Devon Council regarding shared services, although the two councils have different working procedures. Mr.Carson mentioned that Bigbury Parish Council now had a number of new Councillors and their Chairman is considering arranging various courses which are available from Devon Association of Parish Councils. However these are held at some distance from this area. He asked if the other Charterland Councils have any interest in this, then the courses could be held locally.

#### ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

Cllr.Reynolds has spoken with the owners of Maple Bank to ascertain which hedge belongs to them and which belongs to Parish Council. The portion of the laurel hedge on the corner, opposite the gate to Mandava's garden, is outside Maple Bank's boundaries and is, therefore, the responsibility of the Parish Council. It was also agreed that Cllrs. J.Deverson and B.Lambell will clear the silt from the drainage channel.

Cllr.Deverson reported that The Vean drop drain had now been installed.

Once again the road markings between the church and the bus shelter were discussed.

Cllr.Hitchmough understood that the two rows of dotted lines indicated that you could exit but not enter. There was some disagreement about this item which will be discussed later when more information is received.

Public Path Diversion - Under section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act the path from Houghton to the Telephone exchange will be re-routed.

#### PLANNING

Producing a Local Plan was discussed and it was decided that this under taking was not appropriate for a Parish of our size.

#### PARISH PLAN

A Charterlands Cluster Meeting will be held on Monday 27th February 2012 at 7.00pm at Aveton Gifford hall. The Chairman asked Cllrs, to send their agenda items to Cllr.Carson.

A meeting was held in January and various ideas were discussed, one of which was a street party. Highways will be asked if closure of the road from Walnut Tree Cottage to The Vean is possible. Further details will be published. Parish Council have agreed to fund the event up to a certain amount.

## National Trust

With most of the winter behind us, February is the month we start to notice the days become ever so slightly longer and we look forward to the good times of spring and summer ahead.

New this year to the South Devon team is myself, Claire Courtier, who joined the National Trust in early January 2012. Highlights of my first week have to be exploring the sites across the property, carrying out maintenance work in some dramatic stormy weather, and moving the Dartmoor ponies, which I had been led to believe would be rather aloof but to my surprise followed us far to easily to their new grazing compartment without problem. Having grown up in South Devon I am thrilled to have the opportunity to look after this stretch of coastline and over the next few months I look forward to meeting everyone locally.

As you may be aware, we have been working with the South West Coast Path team on a project between Toby's Point and Ayrmer Cove to relocate 1000 m of the coast path fence line away from the eroding cliff edge. This will allow walkers and other users of the path a more enjoyable walk, without sacrificing the stunning views looking down into Ayrmer Cove and back over Bigbury and Burgh Island. Work is due to commence over the next couple of months and will be completed in time for the start of the summer season.

We are also about to get back underway with the Ringmore orchard project after the initial work which started in November with the clearance of the site. Orchard volunteer ranger John Reynolds has organised a community group that will carry out maintenance work to restore the orchard back to its full potential. For more information on getting involved please speak to John. The rangers are looking forward to seeing how the orchard improves in the year ahead.

Finally from us, a very big thank you to everyone that has helped to keep Ayrmer Cove looking at its best. There has been a real effort from the local community to keep the beach free from marine litter. In winter months we often see an increase in litter being washed ashore and the rangers really appreciate all your support.

A number of Parishioners are suffering from coughs and colds. Try this:

#### HEALING CHICKEN AND GINGER BROTH

- 3 x Skinless chicken breasts, cut into strips
- 1.4 litres Strong chicken stock
- 4 cm Fresh root ginger, pealed and cut into thin strips
- 1 x Small red chilli, deseeded and finely sliced
- 125g Pack Baby Sweetcorn, rough chopped
- 2 x Large carrots, cut into matchsticks
- 200g Uncooked egg noodles or 250g cooked rice
- 4 x Spring oinions, finely sliced
- Small handful fresh parsley, finely chopped

Put chicken in pan of cold water and bring to boil. Simmer gently for 5 min or until cooked through. Bring stock to boil and add ginger and chilli. Simmer few minutes then add sweetcorn, carrots, noodles or rice and most of spring onions. Simmer until noodles (if using) are cooked and the vegetables are just softening. Chop chicken and add to soupl. Place in bowls and sprinkle over the remaining spring onions and the parsley.

(If you have any leftover cooked chicken, use this instead of poaching chicken)

It was reported that the Planning Committee would be considering the proposal for an alternative route to Challaborough the following day. The All Hallows yew tree was measured for the second time and, as well as being in good shape, it was found to be five years older than the last time it was measured in 2006!

#### RTNGMORE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

At 7.35 p.m. Barry Old, the Society Secretary introduced our speaker, James Stevenson. James's title was 'Dartmouth Conspiracy – the True Story'. There followed an hour of delight in which James described a bombing raid on the Royal Naval College at Dartmouth drawing largely on his own recollections, records from the Public Record Office and others' reminiscences.

How was it that a Focke-Wulf plane bombed the College that day securing a direct hit and why that day? Why was there only one fatality and not a single Officer Cadet? Why were the cadets all on the River Dart receiving sailing instruction? Czech pilots, some of whom had tried to intercept the Focke-Wulf, received the most appalling punishments including execution when they returned home after the War, several with English wives. Why? James lived near the College as a boy and later became intrigued to search for the answers to these questions. However extraordinary it all seemed, James's answers in his richly illustrated talk satisfied his audience. His novel on the subject entitled 'Dartmouth Conspiracy' is still available second-hand on Amazon and on website www.abebooks.co.uk
