NOTHING TO REPORT



NATIONAL TRUST

It is early spring and as the sun shines increasingly overhead it brings a new lease of life to the National Trust ranger team and to our daily routine.

Spring is full of change and this month we would like to welcome and introduce Emma Reece. Emma says 'I previously worked on Berry Head National Nature Reserve for a conservation charity in Torbay, carrying out community involvement work. I am really excited to join the South Devon team and to work in such a beautiful area. I'm looking forward to working on new sites and meeting the volunteers and community; developing new projects so people can get the most out of these fantastic areas'.

Early on this month the Ringmore orchard volunteers will be back out in force to install a new bench with scenic views out across Ringmore and will create a footpath through the orchard site to ease access. For more information please speak to John Reynolds. A very big thank you to all the volunteers involved for all their hard work and dedication!

The improvement project at Toby's Point and Ayrmer Cove is nearing completion. The contractors have efficiently relocated 1000 metres of the coast path fence line away from the eroding cliff edge. Walkers and other users of the path can ensure a safe and enjoyable walk, with stunning views looking down into Ayrmer Cove and back over Bigbury and Burgh Island.

If you interested in learning how to live entirely on what nature provides, with an adventure scenario of being marooned on the coastline, well Trueways Survival may be of interest.... Trueways survival are running a coastal course at Ayrmer Cove this month and offer the opportunity to learn and practice the skills and techniques needed to survive without the comfort and convenience of four walls and a supermarket! MINUTES OF FEBRURY MEETING - Signed as correct.

MATTERS ARISING

The new litter bin is now in place.

The galvanised gates that have replaced stiles on some footpaths are for the benefit of the elderly and disabled users.

Charterlands Cluster Meeting – The Chairman stated that the meeting was very good and informative with Malcolm Elliot SHDC speaking about progress with the amalgamation of services between West Devon and South Hams. He reported that development management and strategic planning were now one service. The aim was to develop the understanding of the planning process. Other items discussed at the Cluster Meeting were – Parish Lengthsmen – Villages in Action – Snow Wardens – Broadband – Councillor Training – Localism and Oversized Vehicles in Villages.

It was agreed to hold four meetings a year arranged in alphabetical parish order.

SHDC Planning Applications for Challaborough (on the Bigbury side of the bay) Mr.Carson will arrange for South Hams Planning to confirm by E-Mail to the Clerk that they will forward plans which apply to this area.

W.MUMFORD

Budgets have been agreed. £10M has been earmarked for spending on upgrading care homes, especially for dementia patients. The Parish Lengthsman services have been improved with extra funding. Cllr.Deverson reported that he had spoken to Mr. N. Colton (Highways) regarding a virtual footpath from The School House to the entrance of the permissive footpath. Mr.Colton has stated that they no longer use virtual footways in Devon as they are not approved by the Department of Transport.

Mr.Mumford stated that there maybe ways around this situation.

The introduction of broadband to rural areas is well under way with a contractor soon to be announced. Mr.Mumford encouraged councillors to persuade as many people as possible to go into the broadband website to register their support for high speed broadband in Devon at http://www.connectingdevonandsomerset.co.uk to express our need for this improvement.

B.CARSON

Cllr.Carson also mentioned that the Cluster Meeting was informative and in future could prove very useful. He updated the council on the proposed sites for the affordable housing in St.Anns' Chapel. He stated that a new software programme had been installed which will enable benefit claims to be processed much faster. At the Ivybridge Cluster Meeting the Chairman was of the opinion that the majority of small councils did not see the point of having a Link Officer when we already have District and County Councillors who are adequate for dealing with problems that arise. However, the Link Officer has now been appointed and council feel this is a complete waste of money in the present economic climate. With this in mind, a letter will be sent by the Clerk objecting to this appointment as a waste of Council Tax money.

ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

Cllr.Lambell expressed his disgust at the amount of plastic dog fouling bags that have been thrown into the hedges by the National Trust carpark, and questioned who was responsible for removing them. Cllr.Deverson will speak with the National Trust

Cllr.Deverson will speak to N.Colton to ascertain the work schedule of the Parish Lengthman.

The Chairman mentioned that the amount of notices and posters which are being pinned to the bus shelter was unacceptable, and that these should be put in the notice board which is inside the shelter. The Parish Council notice board is for council use on the left hand side and for parish information on the right hand side.
