#### ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN AND VICE CHAIRMAN

Having expressed their agreement to serve again, Michael Hammond was proposed, seconded and unanimously voted in as Chairman and James Parkin was proposed, seconded and unanimously voted in as Vice Chairman of the Parish Council.

OPEN SESSION - Nothing to report

#### MINUTES OF APRIL MEETING

Amendment under Environmental Matters: The penultimate sentence should have read: Cllr.Lambell and Cllr.Deverson stated they intended to cut the laurel hedge in Darkie Lane but would take another look at it and speak to Mr Dudley-Cave.

The minutes were amended and signed as correct.

#### MATTERS ARISING

Painting the Interior of the Bus Shelter - It was reported that Andi King had now painted the interior of the bus shelter.

#### B. CARSON

Cllr Carson confirmed that at the next Chartlands Cluster Meeting is at Bigbury Memorial Hall at 7.00pm on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> June. Localism would be discussed and asked that, if there was any other issues that the Parish Council wished to raise, to let him know by Friday 8<sup>th</sup> June.

#### APPOINTMENT OF PARISH CLERK

It was agreed that it would be very difficult to replace Margaret.

The Chairman confirmed that until a new clerk is appointed he will be the acting clerk. He was unable to put forward any proposals as to time scales. A number of options for Recruitment were suggested.

#### ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

Work Schedule of Parish Lengthsman – Cllr. Deverson reported that he had spoken to the lengthsman, Rob Hutchins, who had informed him that a new arrangement was in place and that he would come to the Parish every 56 days for work for two days. <u>Footpaths:</u>It has been reported that the path between Ringmore and St. Ann's Chapel needed attention. The Footpath Warden stated that he was aware of this and he would be attending to it. It was also reported that Ayrmer Path also needs attention as it is overgrown.

Darkie Lane: Cllr. Deverson reported that he had spoken to Mr. Dudley-Cave and it had been suggested that the Council would cut the laurel hedge down to half its present height and that Mr. Dudley-Cave would maintain this height at no cost to the Council. This was agreed.

P3 Grant: The Chairman reported that he had received a letter from Devon County Council regarding the Parish Paths Partnership Scheme in which it was stated that they would not be making a P3 grant to the Parish this year and thanked those volunteers who had carried out work over the year.

#### PLANNING

Application 40/0939/12/F Elmsleigh Revised Driveway No objection but it was requested that it was made clear that gates and the planting of shrubs as screening were of paramount importance.

#### PARISH PLAN

Oil Cllr. Reynolds reported that, having researched the Devon Oil Collective Plan, he was satisfied that our existing scheme could not be improved upon but that he would keep liaising with the supplier to ensure that our prices are in parity with the Collective.

#### FINANCE

Cheques agreed and signed: Ken Abraham, Audit: £50.00 James Parkin, Refreshments for AGM: £21.77

#### QUEEN'S JUBILEE

Cllr. Hitchmough reported that plans for the street party were on track. To date approximately £334.00 has been spent. Volunteers would be requested to help decorate the "street" and to set-up and dismantle on the day and there is a meeting planned for Friday 1<sup>st</sup> June at 6.00pm in the Parish Room to organise this. Cllr. Deverson confirmed that he would cut back the overhanging ivy before the event.

#### CLUSTER MEETINGS

The Chairman informed the Councillors that he had attended on the 10<sup>th</sup> May the Super Cluster Meeting at Rattery. The Agenda was firstly concerning the Localism Act-Community Powers, Opportunities and Challenges, and secondly the introduction to the new grant pot called Town And Parish Fund.

#### ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Parish Room: Cllr. Parkin, on behalf of the Parish Room Committee, reported that a sycamore tree in the Parish Room grounds was to be felled and the copper Beech was to be crown lifted. The Parish Council agreed to put this on next months Agenda with the proposal of contributing £100.00 towards the cost...

Dog Waste Bin: Because of complaints regarding the positioning of the new dog waste bin, after lengthy discussion, it was agreed to look into finding a suitable new position, at no cost to the Parish Council.

It was confirmed that, since producing the minutes of the April meeting, it had been clarified that dog waste bins will be emptied twice a week.

Mud in Bus Shelter: The Council wished to express their thanks to Andi King for clearing mud out of the bus shelter that had been washed in during a recent storm.

After a fantastic start to the season, the weather soon turned into a washout, but despite the down pours, he birds are nesting and frantically feeding young, the wildflowers are flourishing and the National Trust team have been as busy as ever.

The volunteers at Ringmore orchard are hard at work for another action packed day with ranger Mark and John Reynolds on Sunday 20 May. They will be continuing with the new footpath, installing steps and putting in a new bench. Please contact John if you would like to hear more about the volunteers.

School week with the National Trust will be held between 18-23 June on Bolberry Down. Schools from the surrounding area have been invited to join the ranger team and will be bug hunting, stream dipping, creating beach art and making lanterns. This is a great way for the children to learn about the countryside and to gain practical skills!

The new improvements to smugglers footpath and the new fencing between Toby's Point and Ayrmer have been complete for over a month now, and makes for a fantastic walk. The view from the top of Toby's Point cannot be beaten! Look out for the nationally rare Cirl Bunting, Peregrines and Cormorants, Stone chats and Kestrels are all commonly spotted on this route so keep your eyes peeled!

To support children 'Getting outdoors and closer to nature' National Trust has launched an adventurous outdoors 'todo' list – '50 things to do before you're 11%4'. The campaign is being launched as a response to the report which highlights evidence of a long-term and dramatic decline in children's relationship with the outdoors – so called 'nature deficit disorder'. The report found children today spend fewer than 10% of their playtime in wild places. Instead the younger generation spend an average of two-and-a-half hours a day watching the television! The campaign was developed as a way to encourage outdoor activities through set goals that can be achieved. Completion of '50 Things' is a challenge, and they will be able to chart their own progress and compete with others to maintain interest. Parents are encouraged to get involved in helping their children achieve this. The checklist for under-12s includes setting up a snail race, damming a stream and making a mud pie amongst many others. ### Royal British Legion



Some of you may know different, but the Royal British Legion does not just exist to provide financial assistance to serving and ex servicemen and women, and their families. It also fights tirelessly for the rights of those people too.

One such example is the Military Covenant. In 2007, The Royal British Legion called on Government to honour its lifelong duty of care to those making a unique commitment to their country by honouring the Military Covenant with our Armed Forces. The campaign lasted four years and achieved its objectives.

Milestones included securing significant improvements to the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme, the publication of the first ever cross-departmental strategy on improving Armed Forces welfare (the Service Personnel Command Paper) and getting the principles of the Covenant written into law.

Soldiers will be called upon to make personal sacrifices – including the ultimate sacrifice – in the service of the Nation. In putting the needs of the Nation and the Army before their own, they forego some of the rights enjoyed by those outside the Armed Forces. In return, British soldiers must always be able to expect fair treatment, to be valued and respected as individuals, and that they (and their families) will be sustained and rewarded by commensurate terms and conditions of service. In the same way the unique nature of military land operations means that the Army differs from all other institutions, and must be sustained and provided for accordingly by the Nation. This mutual obligation forms the Military Covenant between the Nation, the Army and each individual soldier; an unbreakable common bond of identity, loyalty and responsibility which has sustained the Army throughout its history. It has perhaps its greatest manifestation in the annual commemoration of Armistice Day, when the Nation keeps covenant with those who have made the ultimate sacrifice, giving their lives in action.

Our branch holds meetings on the first Wednesday of each month (with the exception of January, June, July and August. Membership is open to everyone, regardless of whether or not you have served in the Military or not.

Our next meeting will be held at the Dolphin Inn, Kingston at 19:30hrs on Wednesday 6th June.

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
