A SPIRITUAL MOT . . .

We use "A Wee Worship Book" produced by the Iona Community for Morning Prayer each day in St George's Modbury. Although we have used it for several years now, I still find some of its phrases grab hold of me and make me think; here's one:

> "O God of life, eternity cannot hold you, nor can our little words catch the magnificence of your kindness. Yet in the space of our small hearts and in silence you can come close and **repair** us."



The word "repair" struck me. Although we live in a time when many things are thrown away when they go wrong and we buy a new replacement; when it comes to the big things like a house or a car or relationships, we know the value of repairs. So what repairs might the "God of life" be able to do for us? It all depends where we have gone wrong; and that's between us and Him.

This month we come to the season of Lent, which starts on Ash Wednesday 13th February and ends on Easter Day 31st March. For Christians Lent is a time to review our lives, a sort of spiritual MOT. If you would like the "God of Life" to "repair" you, then pop into your local church for a service.

Lentwise - Spiritual essentials for real life

Many of the churches in our team are doing the Lentwise course, which has five sessions:

- 1. Compass: Finding direction
- 2. Nourishment: Keeping going
- 3. Light: Gaining wisdom
- 4. Shelter: Finding security
- 5. Water: Enjoying refreshment

We will be exploring different aspects of the faith journey. If you would like to take part, speak to someone in the ministry team. Course books are available for £5.

MINUTES OF A MEETING HELD ON 22 JANUARY 2013 IN THE W.I. HALL, RINGMORE AT 7.00 PM

COMMENTS FROM MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC 01/13 Flooding in the village

The members of the public had attended to comment on the recent flooding of roads and properties in the village. JD recounted that the problem had been reported to DCC in 2012 (Minute 22/12 refers) and a plan of action agreed. However there had been no indication as to when the necessary works would be carried out.

WM summarized the responsibilities of the various agencies in dealing with flooding. It was noted that the rainfall throughout 2012 had been exceptional. DCC was struggling to cope with remedial works throughout the county and the total additional costs were likely to exceed £17m.

WM would discuss the situation with the Highway Neigbourhood Officer for the area and report back. It was noted that grants could be available from the Locality Budget in order to fund local initiatives for flood prevention work.

The feeling of the meeting was that whilst it recognized DCC's difficulties it would appreciate a commitment to a date when the remedial works to the camber of the roads and additional drains would be carried out.

It might be helpful each autumn to clear gullies of leaves and scrape the edges of the roads. JD volunteered to try and get supplies of sandbags from the SHDC depot at Tones.

January has been a busy month for the South Devon Ranger team. We have been dealing with landslips, blocked pipes, bridge repairs and eroding streams due to the adverse weather we have had recently. The rangers are out and about checking our paths but if you have any concerns about any of the South Devon National Trust land feel free to contact the rangers on 01548 562344.

The footpath below Lower Manor farm became flooded at the end of December, as the debris brought down the stream by the abnormal amount of rainfall caused the bridge pipe to block. Head Ranger Simon Garner and Ranger Emma Reece were on site Christmas Eve unblocking the pipe. The team then put their dam making skills to the test, to try and direct the water back into the stream channel and not out across the field (many thanks to John and Jane Reynolds for their assistance).





Along the cliff face near Scobbiscombe farm the bad weather has created a series of large holes near the coastal path. The holes have been cordoned off to keep visitors away from the hazard.

Two of our Rangers joined the New Year's day dip at Wembury beach and braved the sea. It was a warm sunny day (for January), with a good turn out of over 200 swimmers, a good way to start the year. The rangers used the lucky go-pro camera which was knocked off

For our January meeting we had a feast of outstanding photographs with a lively commentary as Phill and Sally Errett described their "trip of a life-

time" to Canada and Alaska. They took a coach tour through the Rockies, followed by the Rocky Mountaineer train to Vancouver, cruised from Vancouver to Alaska and back, and finally visited Vancouver Island.

Their first view of the magnificent and unspoiled Rockies from Yellowhead Pass was superb; by contrast the later slides of the Colombia icefield showed us how fast the Athabasca glacier is retreating - about 2-3 metres each year. After chasing elusive elk in Banff they visited Medicine Lake, where the water disappears each summer into a huge hole in the lake bed, which drains into an underground canyon. Their tour took them to many other beautiful places but eventually they arrived in Calgary. From here their train journey wound its way past lakes and mountains to Vancouver where they visited totem poles and glimpsed a band of raccoons, who always relish a photo shoot.

The cruise to Alaska gave Phill and Sally opportunities to see black bears catching salmon as they swam up river to spawn – **the last photo gave us a remarkably close up view!** All in all a wonderful evening and one we shall all remember.






