#### Dear Friends and Neighbours,

This letter celebrates harvest – a time or times of thanksgiving. The first to appreciate this year is the bumper crop of visitors to the West Country and crowded beaches, because of the number of sunny days. While travelling in northern France we saw fields full of sunflowers, some of which will make their way to bottles of cooking oil, and vineyards too, ready for a later harvest of light white and rosé wine. Some local farmers have already begun using combine harvesters to gather in wheat and barley.

In the past our globalised world praised God for the abundance of the harvest, which from seed scattered in handfuls grew to provide enough for families and whole communities. It was a communal effort to gather in and celebrate. A Harvest Thanksgiving service was a bigger occasion, with the church building decorated with produce. The multiplication of seedtime and harvest was seen as Gods' arithmetic. Part of the story of his love for mankind. Could it not be the same for you this year?

Christ saw in the story of the fields, crops and animals a symbol of the generosity of God's love. As we have received so we are asked to give. In the Communion Service (the Eucharist – which means thanksgiving), we see how God takes what we have to offer and transforms it into an enormous harvest of love for our community and for the world.





I hope you are all enjoying the summer and that the children are enjoying the school holidays. If any of the Kids are getting bored how about trying to complete all the 50 things to do before you are 1134. Many families enjoyed bug hunting with Ranger Lorna at Overbecks in Salcombe over the weekend. The Bug Hunters explored the house gardens searching for minibeasts and then headed out into the woodland behind the house to try their hand at pond dipping and butterfly catching. The groups caught plenty of tadpoles, newts, freshwater shrimps and dragonfly larvae, with even a few of the adults managing to catch a butterfly in the nets. All were safely released.

A team of Natural England volunteers joined intern Rebecca Eddy for a day of ragwort pulling at Wembury Point this month. The group usually volunteer at Yarner Wood and East Dartmoor NNR. Rebeccca used to volunteer with this group, 'it was great to have their help, and to share the sites I now work on. They did a brilliant job and really helped us blast through this task.' The volunteers were then treated to a BBQ at the volunteer accommodation as a thank you for their hard work.

Rangers Lorna and Marc had an enjoyable time at Yealmpton show talking to people and helping children make kites from plastic bags and drawing pictures. The children loved organizing the snail races and lots of noise was made as we cheered each snail on.

The fence line has now been moved back on the coastal path to the west of Ayrmer cove. This will enable the path to be moved in away from the cliff edge which has been suffering from erosion due to the winter flood damage. This work was funded through the Great South West Walks and the RDPE, as part of the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the South West Coast Path, as well as through funding from the National Trust.

At the beginning of September we will be undertaking some path and drainage improvements to Ayrmer Lane (the footpath leading down to Ayrmer beach from the car park). Unfortunately a drainage pipe has broken under the path and so we will be using a mini digger to re-new this section of pipe. Please look out for any warning notices and we apologise in advance for any inconvenience this may cause.

On Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> August the Ringmore Orchard Volunteers will be joining Ranger Joel for a day clearing vegetation and installing a bench. The fruit crop is looking good this year – so the group are looking forward to pressing the apples later in the autumn

#### **The Orchard**

On Sunday 18th August, a group of local volunteers, led by National Trust Ranger Joel Wakeling, made further progress on the renovation of the orchard, planted early in the last decade with traditional West Country trees, and which is accessed from the permissive footpath, at the signpost near the top of the wood across the valley from Lower Manor Farm.

The team successfully cleared the previously installed footpath and steps to and through the orchard, which contains fruit trees such as Winter Stubbard, Paignton Marigold, Cornish Pine and Upton Pine variants of apple, as well as wild pear, cherry plum and crab apple trees. After an initial heavy strim through the orchard, the bases around all the trees were cleared of vegetation to allow each tree the best opportunity to thrive. All the trees were label tagged with their specific varieties, and, at the top corner of the orchard, a bench was installed to allow visitors

to rest a while and enjoy the view back across the valley to Ringmore.

Thanks for their hard work go to Andrew, Sarah, Judith, Andi, Perry, Joel and his Dad, John, and to Jane for the welcome refreshments as well as her work on the ground.

We hope that Parishioners and visitors alike will enjoy a walk to the orchard, and the views it offers. John Reynolds

## Royal British Legion

What a glorious summer we have had and I must say it has been a long time coming. Our branch, although not holding meetings during the last few months, has still been active.

We currently have a project in hand to renovate the War Memorial in the churchyard of St. James The Last in Kingston. Working in conjunction with Kingston Parish Council, we have set the wheels in motion to source grants for the work to be carried out by recognised stonemasons. The cost of renovation/cleaning is in the region of £700. Luckily, we have had a positive response from the War Memorial Trust for 50% of the cost, dependant on the submission of a fairly in depth application, which left us with the remaining 50% to be sourced from somewhere else. I am pleased to announce that at the Annual Cricket Match between Kingston and Modbury, the proceeds of the collection made at that match, was donated to the renovation work. A total of £351.97 was made which has put us well on track to get the necessary work done. Of course there are a number of people that must be thanked for this, not least of all, to Alison & Richard Sanderson who hosted the event and agreed to the money raised to go to this project. To Tony Walters, our Poppy Appeal Organiser for providing the tent, to Nick Oatway for providing a tent and his excellent BBQ expertise, to Geoff & Pete Smith for providing the barrels of beer, to Charles Baughan for providing his fantastic Westaway sausages, to Darren Neil on an excellent job as the groundsman and of course the ladies and gentleman of both Kingston and Modbury that played or supported their teams. A very BIG thank you to you all.

One of a team of 12, Derek was asked by a friend if he would be intersted in cycling from London to Paris to raise money for Alzheimer's research. As both their fathers suffer from dementia and alzheimer's, he agreed straight away. After talking to more friends, some as far afield as Scotland and Australia, they started training in January.

Leaving Trafalgar Square on 1st August, they cycled 65 miles to Newhaven. Day 2 saw them boarding a ferry to Dieppw followed by a 40 mile trip to Forges-les-Eaux. Day 3 was a very challenging leg of 88 hilly miles to Clergy-Pontoise. During this stage Derek came off his bike, badly cutting his elbow and bruising his hip but all credit to him for finishing the day. Day 4 saw them cycling 40 or so miles to the finishing line, the Eiffel Tower, where family and friends waited to welcome them.

So far the team have raised over £23,000.00 and it is still rising. The Parish or Bust website will stay open for donations until December./

#### Crab & Asparagus Risotto with Tomato & Apple Salsa

-----

#### Ingredients

2 Crab Claws per person

400g Crab meat

1tbs olive oil

1.25l Fish Stock

30g unsalted butter with 50ml olive oil and 1 tspn

1 small onion, finely chopped

440g Arborio rice

200ml white wine

1tbs lemon juice

1 bunch fresh asparagus, diagonally sliced

Chopped parsley

Grated parmesan

#### For the Tomato & Apple Salsa

Finely dice 2 medium tomatoes and 1 Pink Lady Apple and mix with 50ml olive oil and 1 tspn chopped Coriander

#### Method

Crack the crab claws, remove all the shell, but leave the claws whole and set aside.

Heat half the butter in a frying pan over a low heat. Add the chopped onion and cook for 1-2 minutes until soft. Add the rice and stir to coat the grains. Add the wine and cook for a further 2-3 minutes. Add the stock a ladleful at a time, allowing each to be absorbed before adding the next. Continue stirring constantly for about 20 minutes until all the liquid is absorbed and the rice is cooked but still firm to the bite.

Gently stir in the crab meat, asparagus, lemon juice and parmesan, season with sea salt and black pepper to taste. Melt the remaining butter and gently fry the whole crab claws for about 4-5 minutes turning regularly.

Divide the risotto amongst the serving dishes and top with extra parmesan shavings and place 2 crab claws for each person on top.

Sprinkle with the chopped parsley and add the tomato & apple salsa round the edge of the dish.

This very popular dish is a delicious taste of the sea and we hope very much that you enjoy it at home as much as the Shackers do here!!

My partner and I have been looking into adoption.

The adoptees in this country all display certain behaviours, or they can't be placed in a particular environment or with particular people.....






