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

The Wells at Ringmore Vean

Ringmore Vean was not mentioned in the list of wells around Ringmore so I thought I would let you know about them and boost the total so far. We have four wells at the property, the first is at the furthest corner of our garden and is fed from somewhere under the King's property Mandava. This feeds into a second well close by and the water then runs under ground and comes out into our stream, leading to our pond and then out to the pond in the King's field. The third is a butter well, with its tiny trickle of icy cold water flowing through it all the time. The fourth is fed from the butter well and this too drains out into the stream and away down the valley. The fourth well used to have a pump attached to it (the pump is still in the garden) and this was used to pump water into the slate water tank (this can still be seen perched on top of our back hallway). This would have given the household gravity fed running water in the house. **Karen Purdy**





By my reckoning this now makes 21 wells in or near the village, but there may be more. We don't have all the facts about the history of the village and we are intent on filling the gaps. If any readers have information about the history of their property we would welcome the information and would ask them to get in touch with any member of the Committee

ALAN MCCARTHY 04.05.1945 - 13.11.2013



Alan joined in enthusiastically and wholeheartedly to everything he committed to. He helped Dennis and Di out as a part time farmer when they were away. Undertook decorating, painting, and general all round handy man jobs for various people – there wasn't anything he didn't turn his hand to. He was a Parish Councillor, the P3 Co-ordinator (or footpath warden) organized beach cleans and did a great deal of work on the paths himself. He was Chairman of the Short Bowls Club, sometime builder of fences at Flete Point to Point Course, time keeper and scorer for the Inter Parish Quiz, question master for quizzes at Bigbury and Ringmore where he successfully kept all the unruly in order, twice winner of the darts competition in the JE, helped out in the JE, helped out at the WI and All Hallows fetes by making and hosting many children's games (who could possibly forget 'Splat the Rat'), erecting and dismantling marguees and generally running around and sometime stand in parish newsletter deliverer. He helped Phill with the village Christmas tree every year (Phill has said that he

now needs to fill the void and would welcome a willing volunteer). There isn't an organization or society in the village he hasn't helped either with his time or his talents.

His self-taught woodworking skills were legend and his work can be seen all over the village – for instance, noone would be standing safely in the pulpit without him.

He was a life time supporter of the Royal British Legion having been involved by his Grandfather. He ran the 100 Club and after a while, when Guy was satisfied he had completed his apprenticeship he ran the RBL auction for 10 years.

He was the RBL representative on the Parish Room Committee and then became the Chairman. He found funds for the refurbishment, which was no mean feat and travelled to meetings to put forward the case. He spent many hours doing the work himself. His legacy will be a warm, clean and comfortable facility which will be enjoyed by many people for many years to come.

All through his illness he never complained, was never angry and approached it in the same way he approached life – full on and looking it in the eye.

He was well loved, a loving husband, father, grandfather, loyal and steadfast friend.

Ringmore WI – November Meeting

Ringmore WI members and visitors were very interested in hearing Roger Barrett's talk about his time as a guide at the Start Bay Lighthouse.

The talk commenced with a short film from an edition of 'Countryfile' a few years previously. Matt Baker was shown over the lighthouse by Roger Barrett.

Roger then went on to outline the history of building lighthouses and the need for them along various parts of the coastline. Nearer to this part of the world he showed artists sketches of the original, and second build, the of Eddystone lighthouse, both of which were made from wood, and looked extremely decorative, rather than functional. Eventually the design, as in Smeaton's Tower on the Hoe, was adopted. This lighthouse is only on The Hoe due to the rocks below Smeaton's Tower at the Eddystone becoming unstable. A new lighthouse – the one we see when we look out across the water now - was built on more stable rocks.

Everyone very much enjoyed a first rate speaker with good slides to enhance the talk.

Our next meeting is on Thursday January 9th at 8.00pm when Roger Tyler will be speaking about the Kingsbridge Foodbank. This is one of the two charities which we are supporting at the present time. All are welcome.

RINGMORE PARISH COUNCIL COUNCILLOR VACANCY

A casual vacancy exists on the Parish Council and applications are invited from prospective councillors. If you would like to be considered please let the clerk know at the address below.

If you would like to know more about being a councillor please contact one of the councillors.

When a casual vacancy arises, the council must as soon as practicable, give public notice of the vacancy by posting the notice in some conspicuous place or places within the parish or community.

If within 14 days after public notice has been given, at least ten electors give written notice to the proper officer of South Hams District Council at Follaton House, Totnes, TQ9 5NE of a request for an election to fill the vacancy, then a by-election must be held except where a vacancy occurs within six months of the next ordinary elections.

If no by-election is called, the council must as soon as practicable after the 14 day period, fill the vacancy by cooption. If the vacancy falls within the six month period the council may but need not, fill the vacancy.

The council may co-opt whom it pleases to fill a vacancy, provided the person is qualified to be a councillor. The person co-opted must receive a majority of votes of those councillors present and voting at the meeting where the co-option takes place.

Over the winter months volunteer groups have been helping to maintain the National Trust's countryside properties.

The South Devon Volunteer Group has been working with the National Trust to maintain the hedgerows running along Smugglers Path in Ringmore. Hedge laying is an important traditional rural skill. The volunteers work hard to encourage the growth of the hedgerows and improve their overall structure and strength. Over time the hedgerows will create a more effective stock-proof barrier.

At Nodden Mill the Ringmore Volunteer group will be willow coppicing. Willow grows quickly and coppiced willow will produce multiple branches. The aim is to create coppice for future willow harvesting and to base further volunteering opportunities and events around this activity, such as basket and hurdle making.

The work that our National Trust volunteers do is very important to us. Volunteers make a significant contribution to countryside management and without them we would not be able to maintain our places for everyone to enjoy.



Happy Christmas! Are you approaching the season with a groan or a thrill?

Here is something to make you groan

Question: How does King Wenceslas like his pizza?

Church Pre-Christmas Clean up

Quinquennial Inspection work

Following the woodworm treatment on the church during May this year another phase of work has just been completed. This involved cleaning out all the rainwater gutters and down pipes, replacing damaged and missing roof slates de-rusting and painting of the three bells support framework, replacing high level light bulbs and replacing the electrical supply and socket (which failed the electricity safety examination) for the Village Christmas tree. The next phase which is in the process of starting is a full report on the rainwater furniture to find out which requires replacing or just hopefully painting.

Pledged Giving

We will shortly be distributing the 2014 envelopes to those who give regularly to All Hallows. As well as being convenient for the givers, it is a tremendous help to the church and we can also collect the Gift Aid from tax payers which currently enhances contributions by 25%. (Some people give by standing order, which is even easier to administer.) If you do not receive your envelopes in the near future or wish to start participating in the scheme, then please contact Ron Williams, our current Treasurer, on 810851. Many people, mistakenly believe that their giving disappears into central funds via the "Common Fund" and is wasted on unnecessary administration and hierarchy, but the figures show that the cost of the diminishing number of parish clergy exceeds the total contributions to the "Common Fund". This means the churches are net receivers from the diocese and contribute nothing towards the costs of Bishops, Archdeacons, administration etc. and this is true both for Ringmore and for the Modbury Team as a whole. With the remedial work identified by the Quinquennial Inspection this is a difficult time for All Hallows financially and you might like to consider whether you would like to increase your support or to start giving. Without doubt, however, our first priority is to invite you to come to church, whether or not you can contribute financially.
