NEW BRIDGE FOR AYRMER COVE

Following collaboration between Ringmore Parish Council, Devon County Council, the National Trust and Babcock Marine, the old footbridge which was lost in the recent storms, has now been replaced with a brand new bridge. The Parish Council was able to negotiate with Devon County Council's Public Rights of Way Office to provide a replacement bridge, and the National Trust organised a volunteer installation team, through the kind cooperation of Babcock Marine.

A group of Babcock Marine's apprentice marine engineers, liaising with local NT rangers and using the project as part of their development programme, created new abutments and footings, and erected and installed the 5.1 metre, 850 kg bridge, in less than two days. A great result....

ANNUAL RAINFALL

The annual rainfall in 2012 was 1307mm, which is over a third more than the 936mm we had in 2013.


In 2012, despite a dry spring, we had above-average rainfall each month from May to December.

December 2012 was exceptionally wet with 261 mm, almost twice the average for the month.

In 2013 we had an average spring but from May to August only 140 mm fell, which is less than half the norm. However, we had a very wet winter with 587mm (23.5 inches) from November 2013 to February 2014.

Rhubarb Fool

400g (14oz) Rhubarb, trimmed 125g (4oz) Goldern Caster Sugar 50ml (2 fl oz) Grand Marnier or Cointreau – optional 300ml (half pint) Carton Double Cream 500g Tub Low fat Greek Yogurt Half tsp Vanilla Extract

1 Cut rhubarb into 2.5cm (1 in) pieces. Put into pan with 75g (3oz) sugar, Liqueur (if using) and 75ml (3 fl oz) cold water. Bring to boil; simmer Gently for 5 min. Strain rhubarb, reserving syrup.

2 Pour syrup back in pan and simmer until reduced by a third. Cool 3 Whisk cream, yogurt, vanilla and rest of sugar until soft peaks form. Mash half the rhubarb; stir into cream. Fold in remaining pieces. Divide between six glasses. Drizzle on syrup.

Fool & syrup can be made day before. Keep separate and complete

The talk commenced with a brief outline of the Saga Rose ship which looked beautifully equipped, and by all accounts the food served on board the voyage was equally wonderful! A very easy way to put on weight!

Jackie and Michael then talked us through their slides. The voyage, taken in July, commenced at Liverpool and went initially to Greenland, exploring the south-west part of the country. The ship visited Qaqortoq, then went on up into the Arctic Circle and explored Ilulissat and the Eighedsfjord. The scenery was utterly stunning, showing wonderful white capped mountains with stark dark coloured rock. The brilliant blue backdrop of the sky completed the wonderful land-scape. Majestic icebergs, some white, some pale blue, were very much in evidence on the cruise. Leaving Greenland behind the ship sailed through Cape Farewell passage and then onto Iceland. Visits to Reykjavik and Gulfoss Falls, and additionally to see a large geyser erupting, left the audience enthralled. Finally, the ship called into the Faeroe Islands before heading back to mainland Britain.

New Life

By the time you read this, the days will have gradually become longer, with the world of nature starting to awake from its winter sleep, as new shoots appear on the trees and bushes, and daffodils and other bulbs prepare to burst into bloom.

In the Church's year the season of Lent always coincides with the beginning of spring, and this year Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, is on 5th March. There is some diversity of opinion as to the exact origin of the word 'Lent'. Some scholars think that it comes from the old Anglo Saxon word *lenctentid* which was used for the month of March and denoted the lengthening days of spring. Others believe it originates from the Anglo Saxon words *encten foesten* meaning 'spring fast'. However, whichever version we feel drawn to, the link to springtime is clear, with its preparation for the bursting forth of new life.

In a similar way, for each one of us, Lent can be regarded as a time of preparation for new life, as we cut away all that hinders us from becoming the person that God wants us to be. Lent offers us the opportunity to reflect on our lives, to evaluate our priorities, values, and goals, and ask ourselves whether they enable us to live in the way that we know God would have us live. This is also a good time to ask God to work in our lives so that we can make any changes we may need to make like mending any broken relationships or forgiving those who have hurt us. The call of Lent is a call to personal renewal, a call to open our lives more fully to God, which may involve reviewing our spiritual life - how far we have come, and how best we can move forward and deepen our faith, and our awareness of God. This may include self-discipline in giving up, or cutting back on something we enjoy, and then putting the money we would have spent to a good cause. Exactly what form of Lenten preparation our own lives will benefit from most is for each one of us to decide.

And so as we look forward to our Lenten journey we ask the Lord to help us to travel it well so that we will be ready for Easter and the joy of the resurrection.

Open Doors is an international ministry serving persecuted Christians and churches worldwide. Open Doors supplies Bibles, leadership training, literacy programmes, livelihood support and advocacy services. They also seek to mobilise the church in the UK and Ireland to serve Christians living under religious persecution. Open Doors began with one man smuggling Bibles behind the Iron Curtain. Recently a Chinese government official said "The government welcomes the support of the church. We lack the resources to meet all the needs we face, so we need religious organisations in order to do so; and that the beliefs and love of the church were an advantage to society" A few years ago such a statement would have been inconceivable

PCC Meeting

At our recent meeting we welcomed Gilbert Snook who has now been co-opted as a committee member. Many of you will have heard Gilbert giving excellent talks at our services, especially the Village services. In the Woodleigh Deanery there are currently vacancies for stipendiary (paid) clergy in Loddiswell and Thurleston but, with the shortage of clergy nationally and available to our Diocese, it means that only one will be replaced. The PCC discussed a number of possible options that the Deanery proposed. After much discussion it was decided to inform the Deanery of the preferred option of our Team Rector, Neil Barker, living in Modbury to have responsibility and oversight of Modbury, Bigbury, Ringmore, Kingston and Aveton Gifford. Of course we could not speak for other churches within the team but it would considerably reduce Neil's workload to his, and our, benefit in the area.

The Kingsbridge FOODBANK






