within six months after my decease and all who have not attained that age to be paid

also is that if any loss shall arise by means of not getting all my money in which is
now at Urance all and every the legacies do bear a proportionable deduction from the
respective legacies It is also my Will and order that if any or either of the before named
legacies should be under the age of twenty one years at the time of my decease ~~or that any~~
~~or that any~~ that such legacy or legacies which I have given him her or them or under age
shall at the end of six months after my decease be put and placed out at interest
for him her or them in the Naval Bank Plymouth as his her or their property by my
