the age of twenty one years at the time of my decease to be paid their respective legacies
within six months after my decease and all who have not attained that age to be paid
their respective legacies when and as they shall respectively attain that age And my Will
also is that if any loss shall arise by means of not getting all my money in which is
now at present all and every the legacies do bear a proportionable deduction from the
respective legacies It is also my Will and order that if any or either of the before named
legatees should be under the age of twenty one years at the time of my decease abiding
~~anywhere~~ that such legacy or legacies which I have given him her or them so under age
shall at the end of six months after my decease be put and placed out at interest
for him her or them in the Naval Bank Plymouth as his her or their property by my
