ROCK ROAD: Steps for pack animals under the tarmac. He used to bump down them on his bicycle.

The steps were covered by the Water Board.

Village water point where women came to wash their clothes on Mondays. Water comes from spring at the back. Told him by Mr. Luckcraft(?) who built a cottage up lane. Maybe he lived in part of our house – Clegg mentioned. Luckcraft earned his first 6p cutting brambles on a field where Wills house is: kept it on his watch chain.

Foundation of old cottage under Alan King's house –uses the same steps. Area around seat and spring belongs to Parish Council. More foundations where he has built his garage. Quarry? May have been a quarry building? Peg's House burnt down by sheep dip and Peg died, Peg's Field? Where was it?
